Entry Fees: 10% of first-place premium. Payment must accompany entry.

Judging to be held at 7:00 PM, Monday, August 10, 2009.

Awards will be released Sunday, August 16, 2009, between 11 AM and 1 PM

Premiums will be available Wednesday afternoon in the Secretary's office.

1. All entries must be grown by exhibitor.
2. 1 exhibit per class per exhibitor.
3. All entries must be plainly labeled with the variety by exhibitor. Varieties distinctly off type will be disqualified. All classes will be judged on quality of: uniformity in form, size, color, freedom from blemish, and edible quality.
4. All exhibits entered in this department shall become the property of the Palmyra Union Agricultural Society unless prior arrangements are made with the department superintendent.
5. Prizes will not be awarded to exhibits which are unworthy.
6. When an exhibit is not labeled with correct name of variety or varieties, it is disqualified.
7. **NO ONE** is allowed in area while items are being judged.
8. **You may enter only one (1) of the first three (3) sections.**

(Section 1 – Vegetables / Section 2 – Small Back Yard Home Garden / Section 3 – Organic Garden).

SECTION 1 - VEGETABLES

BEST OF SHOW – VEGETABLES – ROSETTE + \$10.00

Class

1. Bak Choi, 1 plant, roots off, any variety.
2. Beans, snap, 12 pods of any green-podded variety, 1/4" stem on.
3. Beans, snap, edible condition, 12 pods of yellow-podded variety, 1/4" stems on. NO VISIBLE SEEDS.
4. Beans, snap, edible condition, 12 pods of Kentucky Wonder, 1/4" stem on. NO VISIBLE SEEDS.
5. Beans, snap, edible condition, 12 pods of purple beans, 1/4" stems on. NO VISIBLE SEEDS.
6. Beets, 5 tops cut off to approximately 1 inch, clean, uniform, any garden variety, 1 inch to 2 1/2" inches diameter. Trim tap root to 1 1/2".
7. Broccoli, 1 head, or bunch of small heads, 6" in diameter.
8. Cabbage, 1 head, 3 to 4 pounds, any variety except kraut types. Untrimmed. 3-4 wrapper leaves on.
9. Cabbage, 1 head, heaviest, kraut type. Untrimmed. 3-4 wrapper leaves on.
10. Cabbage, 1 head, Savoy type. Untrimmed. 3-4 wrapper leaves on.
11. Cabbage, 1 head, red variety. Untrimmed. 3-4 wrapper leaves on.
12. Cabbage, 1 head, Chinese. Untrimmed. 3-4 wrapper leaves on.

13. Carrots, 5, tops cut off to approximately 1 inch, any variety 1-2 1/2" diameter. No green shoulders.
14. Cauliflower, white, 1 head, leaves cut just above head, any variety, 6" minimum diameter.
15. Cauliflower, purple, 1 head, leaves cut just above head, any variety, 6" minimum diameter.
16. Cauliflower, gold, 1 head, leaves cut just above head, any variety, 6" minimum diameter.
17. Celery, 1 plant, any variety.
18. Chard, white, 1 plant, roots off, any variety.
19. Chard, colored, 1 plant, roots off, any variety.
20. Collard Greens, 1 plant, roots off.
21. Cucumbers, 3 slicing condition, best market size 5" or longer. Not over 2" diameter. No yellowing. 1/2" stems.
22. Cucumbers, 6 for dill pickles, 3-5", any pickling variety. 1/2" stems.
23. Cucumbers, 12 under 3" long, for small pickles, any pickling variety. 1/2" stems.
24. Egg Plant, white, 2 with 1/2" stem.
25. Egg Plant, small varieties, 2 with 1/2" stem.
26. Egg Plant, large, 2 with 1/2" stem.
27. Endive, 1 plant, clean, roots off.
28. Garlic, 3 bulbs.
29. Gourds, 1 large, (i.e.:, birdhouse type or apple).
30. Gourds, 3 small – decorative.
31. Honey Dew, 1, mature, any variety.
32. Kale, 1 plant clean, roots off. Mature.
33. Kohlrabi, 3, stump removed, leaves trimmed. Tap root trimmed to 1".
34. Leeks, 3, large, trimmed.
35. Lettuce, leaf, 1 plant, roots off.
36. Lettuce, head, 1, roots off.
37. Muskmelon, 1, mature, round, smooth.
38. Muskmelon, 1, mature, round, deep ribs.
39. Mustard, 1 plant, roots off.
40. Okra, 6, not over 3", stems on.
41. Onions, 5, tops off, trimmed to 1", not peeled. Yellow Globe (round type). Top dried.
42. Onions, 5, tops off, trimmed to 1", not peeled. Ebenezer (flat yellow type). Top dried.
43. Onions, 5, tops off, trimmed to 1", not peeled. Sweet Spanish or any other type. Top dried.
44. Onions, 5, tops off, trimmed to 1", not peeled, Red. Top dried.
45. Peas, 12 pods, 1/4" stem.
46. Bell Peppers, sweet, green, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on. Same number of lobes on all 3.
47. Bell Peppers, sweet, red, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on. Same number of lobes on all 3.
48. Bell Peppers, sweet, yellow, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on. Same number of lobes on all 3.
49. Bell Peppers, sweet, orange, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on. Same number of lobes on all 3.
50. Bell Peppers, sweet, purple, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on. Same number of lobes on all 3.
51. Peppers, sweet, long tapered, 3, any variety. 1/2" stem on.
52. Peppers, hot, long varieties, 3, 1/2" stem on.
53. Peppers, hot, short varieties, 3, 1/2" stem on.
54. Pumpkin, 1 ripe, any field variety. With stem.
55. Pumpkin, 1 ripe, any pie variety. With stem.
56. Pumpkin, largest by weight, ripe. With stem.
57. Pumpkin, White, 1, large variety. With stem.
58. Pumpkin, Ornamental, Miniature, 3. With Stems.
59. Radish, white. Pint basket.
60. Radish, red. Pint basket.
61. Rhubarb, 6 stalks.

62. Spinach, common, 3 plants, clean, roots off.
63. Spinach, New Zealand, half pound, bunch of tips 3-6" long, tied or in transparent bag.
64. Squash, summer, 3, not over 10" long, shells not hardened, yellow var. as Straightneck, Yankee Hybrid, stems on.
65. Squash, summer, 3, not over 10" long, shells not hardened, green varieties, as Cocozelle and Zucchini, with stems.
66. Squash, summer, 3, shells not hardened, any type. Stems on.
67. Squash, miscellaneous, 3, summer type. Stems on.
68. Squash, butternut, 2, 1" stem. Mature.
69. Squash, Spaghetti, 1, ripe. Stems on.
70. Squash, Table Queen or Acorn, 3, mature, dark green stems on.
71. Squash, winter, 1, any variety, mature, stem on.
72. Sweet Corn, white, 5 ears, husks removed, any variety, 1/2" shank.
73. Sweet Corn, yellow, 5 ears, husks removed, any variety, 1/2" shank.
74. Sweet Corn, bicolor, 5 ears, husks removed, any variety, 1/2" shank.
75. Tomatillo, 3, husks on. Stems on
76. Tomatoes, green, 5, over 2" diameter, any round variety, stems off.
77. Tomatoes, ripe, 5, over 2" diameter, any variety, stems off.
78. Tomatoes, ripe, 5, 2" diameter, any variety, stems off.
79. Tomatoes, ripe cherry, 1 pint basket, 1" diameter or less, any variety, stems off.
80. Tomatoes, ripe grape, 1 pint basket, 1" diameter or less, any variety, stems off.
81. Tomatoes, roma, ripe, 5, stems off.
82. Tomatoes, plum, ripe, 1 pint basket.
83. Turnip, 3, Tops trimmed to 1".
84. Watermelon, 1, mature, any variety. Stems on.
85. Watermelon, 1, Seedless, ripe. Stems on.
86. Miscellaneous, any other vegetable not listed (no potatoes). No more than 3 different entries per exhibitor.

Same rules apply. Variety must be listed.

SECTION 3 – ORGANIC GARDEN – LIMIT 6 ENTRIES PER EXHIBITOR

BEST OF SHOW – ORGANIC GARDEN – ROSETTE + \$10.00

**Use same numbers for vegetables that are used in Section 1 but add O to the number.
(i.e.: O-1 is Beans, O-17 is Chard). Classes will run O-1 → O-86**

Same rules apply. Variety must be listed.

SECTION 4 – HERBS

Class 1st: \$5.00 2nd: \$4.00 3rd: \$3.00

1. Basil, 1 plant, roots off.
2. Borage, 1 plant, roots off.
3. Cilantro, 1 plant, roots off.
4. Dill, bunch of 6 seed heads, tied or in a transparent bag.
5. Fennel, 1 bulb.
6. Fennel, 6 stems, tied in a bunch or in a transparent bag.
7. Mint, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
8. Oregano, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
9. Parsley, 1 plant, roots off, good market size and quality.
10. Rosemary, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
11. Sage, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
12. Thyme, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
13. Turnip Greens, 6 stems, tied in a bunch.
14. Other herbs, 6 stems, 4-6" long, tied in a bunch.
