

No "Pets" are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked. If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds.

These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal's protection as well as yours.



RULES AND REGULATIONS **Exhibitor Rules**

- 1. Articles not listed in this book will not be accepted for entry.
- No premium will be paid upon any entry not made at the Secretary's Office.
- 3. All entries are entered and shown at the risk of the owner. The Union Agricultural Society at Palmyra will not be responsible in case of fire, theft, accidental or providential damage or destruction. Precautions will be taken, and experienced superintendents will be in charge of each show.
- 4. The Association reserves the right to substitute a judge at any time it deems necessary.
- 5. Livestock showing any signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the grounds at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
- 6. All entries are final. Payment of an entry fee signifies compliance with the rules set forth in this catalog.

NEW ·

- 7. Any changes within ANY entries AFTER Saturday, August 10th 2024 MUST be brought to the attention of the Secretary prior to Monday August 12th by NOON OR Thursday August 15th by 9AM (FOR DEPARTMENT 02-01- DAIRY CATTLE ONLY). This includes changing of ANY entry even if it FALLS WITHIN THE SAME EXACT CLASS. EVEN MORE IMPORTANT IF IT IS A DIFFERENT CLASS.
- 7A. In regard to rule 7. Transferring of entry fees from one entry to another or exchanging one entry for another due to a change in entry type/department/section/or class WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AFTER Monday August 12th by NOON.
- 7B. ANY CHANGES IN ENTRIES AFTER THE DATES AND TIMES LISTED ABOVE WILL RESULT IN A LATE ENTRY FEE AS WELL AS A "NEW ENTRY" ENTRY FEE. AND MUST BE PAID TO THE SECRETARYS OFFICE PROIOR TO JUDGING OF ENTRIES LISTED AS CHANGED OR NEW FROM EXHIBITOR.
- 7B. Entry Removal: Removing an official entry after Saturday, August 12th will result in the entry fee being donated to the Palmyra Agriculture Society A.K.A Wayne County Fair. Entry Fees Are NO LONGER TRANSFERABLE OR REFUNDED AFTER SAID DATE LISTED.
- 7C. Writing Checks: **There will be a Bounced Check Fee of \$25.00** Per Bounced Check plus the late Entry fee of that class and actual entry fee of that entry Item. For Any Bounced Checks that come through ANY of the Wayne Country Fair Offices.

PLEASE NOTE ****The secretary is ALWAYS in Domestics from 8am- 5pm on Saturday, August 10th)***

- 8. The Wayne County Fair will not be responsible for special awards offered by anyone other than the Association.
- 9. No interference between exhibitor and judge will be allowed.
- 10. Except as noted in Department Rules, NO EXHIBIT, OPEN or 4-H Division, many be removed from the grounds PRIOR to 8:00AM, Sunday, August 18, 2024.(or Premium Monies Will Be FORFEITED).
- 11. Good check, cash, or money order accepted in payment of entry fees.

REMINDER

12. Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH EAST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.



Exhibitor Pre-fair Guidelines

Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas and Alpacas, Cervids, Misc. Ruminants

- Review the animal health requirements booklet including information for your species **before** your veterinarian arrives to inspect your animals. If you have any questions, **ask**.
- Your veterinarian is responsible for inspecting your animals and completing the
 certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI). Call early to avoid the last-minute rush
 when mistakes are made and there is no time to correct.
- Make sure USDA approved official ear tags are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats. Official ID must be applied to animals prior to regulatory testing and completion of the CVI.
- Llamas and alpacas require a microchip or ear tag. If a microchip is utilized
 make sure the veterinarian confirms the microchip ID or places one. If your
 animal is identified by a microchip, make sure you bring a working reader with
 you to the fair.
- ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE RECORDED. Make sure it is.
- Review the CVI carefully upon receipt to make sure all the information is correct including any required test or vaccination information.
- DO NOT stuff it in an envelope and assume all is well. The time to correct is before pulling them out at the fair. The CVI is your document, and you share responsibility if it is incorrect.
- If you are **importing** livestock from out of state, make sure the interstate requirements are met and you have a valid **interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.**

Poultry

- If your flock is participating in the NPIP program, schedule pullorum flock inspection and testing well ahead of the fair.
- If you're having your birds tested within 90 days of the fair, you must go to a pullorum clinic. Available clinics are listed on the Dept. website. No individual testing is available if you miss a clinic.
- Birds qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- **Bring documentation** with you to the fair in the form of a 1) current NPIP certificate, 2) 90-day test chart or 3) purchase receipt with NPIP certification within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Horses

- **NY origin** horses must be accompanied by a negative EIA test report. The date of sample collection for the qualifying EIA test must have been *on or after January 1, 2023.*
- Imported horses (out of state origin) must be accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection with a negative EIA test within 12 months prior to entry. Rabies vaccination information can be incorporated into the CVI.
- Drawing or photograph must match the horse.
- Rabies vaccination must be within 1 year of arrival at the fair and be documented
 by a **signed** rabies certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart with the
 required information (see requirements).

MOST IMPORTANT

When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork and official ID is present and legible. If they are showing any signs of illness, **LEAVE THEM HOME.**

INTERSTATE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIR ANIMALS

This document is a supplement to the Animal Health Requirements (AI-202) published for animals exhibited at New York State county fairs and the State Fair. Its purpose is to summarize the import requirements that must be met for livestock **entering New York** destined for fairs. Please carefully review the Animal Health Requirements. Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination in species not required by the state. Contact the specific fair for their requirements. Fair contact information is available at **www.nyfairs.org**. Further assistance can be obtained by contacting the Division of Animal Industry (DAI) at 518-457-3502 or your State Veterinarian's office. You can also go to the following link on our Dept. website: https://agriculture.ny.gov/animals/animal-import-export

INTERSTATE CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (ICVI)

An interstate CVI is required for cattle, horses, swine, sheep, goats, llamas/alpacas, deer/elk and misc. ruminants moving interstate. Extended Equine CVIs (EECVIs) are acceptable for horses. More information on EECVIs is available at www.globalvetlink.com and from your veterinarian. Note that interstate CVI's must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. A printed copy of the ICVI must be presented for animal check-in.

The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season, from July 1 through Labor Day, interstate CVI's can be used multiple times as long as the initial entrance to a NY fair is within 30 days of CVI inspection and the CVI is initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official at the fair. Once the CVI has been initialed, it can be used for the rest of the fair season if no health issues arise. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI. All documentation <u>must</u> accompany the animals. Animals not meeting the interstate and/or fair requirements will not be allowed on the grounds. Individual official ID is required on all animals. Animals with incomplete or illegible ID will be rejected. Required rabies vaccination may be included on the health certificate.

HORSES

Horses 6 months of age or older must test negative for equine infectious anemia (EIA). The sample collection date for the **qualifying EIA test must be within 12 months prior to the date of entry to the fair**. The horse must be clearly and completely identified. Rabies vaccination is required for all horses 4 months of age and older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months.

CATTLE

Cattle must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. Cattle from all states must be test negative for BVD-PI with results and test date noted on the CVI. For cattle from the New England states, New Jersey, Ohio and Pennsylvania, no additional testing (other than the BVD-PI test) is required. For information on other states, you can contact DAI at 518-457-3971 or check the Department website at https://agriculture.ny.gov/animals/animal-import-export. Vaccination for rabies is required for all cattle 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months. Bovine respiratory disease complex vaccination is also required. Vaccinations must be documented. SHEEP

Sheep can enter with CVI. All sheep must be identified by one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> flock tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the sheep is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program, and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the sheep's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824). The veterinary statement certifying the flock of origin was inspected with no evidence of contagious disease in the flock at the time of inspection is required. Rabies vaccination is required for all sheep 4 months of age and older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months unless a 3- year vaccination has been used. No regulatory tests are required for sheep.

GOATS

Goats can enter with CVI. All goats must be identified by one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the goat's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824). The veterinary statement certifying the herd of origin was inspected with no evidence of contagious disease in the herd at the time of inspection is required. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.* No regulatory tests are required for goats.

SWINE

Swine can enter with CVI only. Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.* No regulatory tests are required for swine.

LLAMAS / ALPACAS

New world camelids attending a New York county or state fair must be accompanied by a CVI with animals individually identified by microchip or official ear tag. They must be test negative for BVD-PI with test date and results noted on the CVI. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.*

DEER/ELK (CERVIDAE)

CWD susceptible cervid species cannot be imported into New York. Non CWD susceptible species require a permit. For information on importing deer contact DAI at 518-457-3502.

POULTRY

Negative avian influenza and pullorum status is required for all poultry entering NY. Out of state poultry must be accompanied by the NPIP flock certificate if the flock is NPIP certified. Otherwise, a CVI is required. Poultry, with the exception of, doves and pigeons, must test negative for pullorum within 90 days prior to importation, if not from an NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock. In addition, all poultry must be 1) from a source flock in which 30 birds were tested negative for avian influenza within ten days prior to entry into New York State; or 2) from an NPIP U.S. H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean or NPIP U.S. Avian Influenza Clean Flock. For more information, contact DAI at 518-457-3971.

MISC. RUMINANTS

Certificate of veterinary inspection and official USDA approved ear tag. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.*

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General Prohibitions and Requirements

- No person shall bring or have present an animal on the fairgrounds for any reason (show, exhibit, raffle, demonstration, display) during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.
- Any animal which is subject to inspection upon entry to the fairgrounds will be inspected without covering (wraps, coats, head gear, etc.).
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.
- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to, or require removal from, the fair premises or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of, or exposed to, any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease.
 - <u>NOTE</u>: The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious, or communicable disease

- (Part 350.10). The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.
- All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, deer, and misc. ruminants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. Wet ink signatures for paper CVIs or e-signature for eCVIs are acceptable.
- A physical CVI must be available to inspection staff for date and approval at time of inspection. This may be a printout of an eCVI or owner's copy of a paper CVI.
- All animals must be officially identified. **ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED.** Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.
- Only one species is allowed per certificate.
- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

New York Origin Livestock:

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI (see below).
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

Out of State Origin Livestock:

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- An e-CVI may be issued but a paper copy of the e-CVI is required for the animal check-in process.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a NY fair must be within 30 days of the date of CVI inspection. In order for the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

Animal Identification

ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED

- Cattle must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended.
- Sheep and goats must be identified by official scrapie identification (see sheep and goat sections below).
- Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. Nursing piglets originating within NYS do not have to be individually identified if the sow is correctly identified on the CVI and the number of piglets in the litter is noted on the CVI. Nursing piglets from out of state will need official ID (see swine section).

- Llamas and alpacas must be identified by official ear tag or microchip.
- Misc. ruminants must be identified by unique ear tag or microchip.
- A complete written description is sufficient identification for horses entering New York accompanied by a CVI. The description must match the EIA test record. Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars, and other markings as necessary to uniquely identify the horse. Tattoos and microchips if any should be included. "Bay, no markings" is not an acceptable description for a CVI or EIA test record.
- <u>NOTE</u>: If you are exhibiting animals identified by microchip, a working reader must be supplied by the exhibitor.
- For questions on animal identification please contact your veterinarian or our office at 518-457-3502.

Rabies Vaccination

- Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) and that are 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to the fair.
 - For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds.
- Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The exception is Imrab LA vaccine used in sheep which protects for 3 years after the second annual vaccination (consult your veterinarian).
- The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- NOTE: Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors. The New York State Fair requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds.

Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the veterinarian administering the vaccine or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration, and the duration of immunity if longer than one year (sheep only).
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on a paper EIA test record, the
 test record must be signed certifying vaccination in addition to the required
 signature for the EIA test record.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is electronically entered into an eEIA test record, only one electronic signature is required.
- NOTE: Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

BVD-PI Testing

 All cattle, llamas, and alpacas exhibited at NY county fairs, or the State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect **Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI)**. Official ID must be in the animal prior to sampling. The testing veterinarian is responsible to make sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, official identification of the animal, and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

Cleaning and Disinfection

 All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).

Animal Deaths

Occasionally animal deaths occur at a fair. If a death occurs, it must be reported
to the state veterinarian in charge as soon as possible for review. The animal must
be promptly removed from the public exhibit area to a secure location and held for
the veterinarian prior to disposal.

Calving, Kidding, and Lambing

 Any cattle, goats, or sheep that calve, kid, or lamb while at a county fair or the State Fair will be ordered removed from the fairgrounds along with their offspring, unless the animals are part of a birthing demonstration.

Commingling of Sheep and Cattle

 Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is strongly recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

Commingling of Swine and Poultry

 Due to the potential spread of influenza virus, it is recommended that swine and poultry be housed in separate locations.

Isolation on Returning Home

 The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin. If any illness is noted in the exhibition animals, the owner should contact their veterinarian immediately.

Individual Species Requirements

Horses

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is <u>not</u> required for New York origin horses. CVI is required for imported horses. Extended Equine CVIs (EECVIs) are acceptable. For more information on EECVIs, visit http://www.globalvetlink.com.
- Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test is required for all horses 6 months of age or older. The horse must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test record, signed by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. The sample collection date for the qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2023, for New York origin horses. For imported horses, the EIA test must have been conducted within 12 months prior to entry. The EIA test certificate must include a complete description of the horse.

 Rabies vaccination within 12 months is required for all horses 4 months of age or older (see above).

Cattle

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- Rabies vaccination is required for all cattle 4 months of age or older (see above).
- All cattle must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- All cattle must be vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with an age appropriate- product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the fair. The date and vaccine product should be documented.

Sheep

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> flock tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the sheep is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program, and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the sheep's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- Rabies vaccination is required for all sheep 4 months of age or older (see above).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the flock of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any sheep, the entire
 exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other
 flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed
 from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately
 after removal.

Goats

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the goat's registration paper. ET tattoo in the ear or tail web. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any goat, the entire
 exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other
 flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed
 from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately
 after removal.

Swine

 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. Out of state nursing piglets need official identification along with the sow. See Animal Identification section above.

Llamas and Alpacas

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- All llamas and alpacas must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Poultry

- Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons, and waterfowl) must be accompanied by 1) results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition <u>OR</u> 2) proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock.
- Poultry qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- Proof of NPIP status must be in the form of an NPIP certificate or purchase receipt containing NPIP certification information. If utilizing a receipt, it must be dated within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Deer/Elk (Cervidae)

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- Originate from a herd classified as accredited or qualified under USDA tuberculosis regulations.
- A movement permit obtained from the Division of Animal Industry is required for all deer movements. All CWD and TB program requirements must be met before a permit will be issued. Questions regarding movement permits should be directed to the Division of Animal Industry at 518-457-3502.

Miscellaneous Ruminants

 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.

Exhibitor Pre-fair Guidelines

Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas, and Alpacas, Cervids, Misc. Ruminants

- Review the animal health requirements booklet including information for your species **before** your veterinarian arrives to inspect your animals. If you have any questions, **ask**.
- Your veterinarian is responsible for inspecting your animals and completing the
 certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI). Call early to avoid the last-minute rush
 when mistakes are made and there is no time to correct.
- Make sure USDA approved official ear tags are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats. Official ID must be applied to animals prior to regulatory testing and completion of the CVI.

- Llamas and alpacas require a microchip or ear tag. If a microchip is utilized
 make sure the veterinarian confirms the microchip ID or places one. If your
 animal is identified by a microchip, make sure you bring a working reader with
 you to the fair.
- ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE RECORDED. Make sure it is.
- Review the CVI carefully upon receipt to make sure all the information is correct including any required test or vaccination information.
- DO NOT stuff it in an envelope and assume all is well. The time to correct is before pulling them out at the fair. The CVI is your document, and you share responsibility if it is incorrect.
- If you are importing livestock from out of state, make sure the interstate requirements are met and you have a valid interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.

Poultry

- If your flock is participating in the NPIP program, schedule pullorum flock inspection and testing well ahead of the fair.
- If you're having your birds tested within 90 days of the fair, you must go to a pullorum clinic. Available clinics are listed on the Dept. website. No individual testing is available if you miss a clinic.
- Birds qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- **Bring documentation** with you to the fair in the form of a 1) current NPIP certificate, 2) 90-day test chart or 3) purchase receipt with NPIP certification within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Horses

- **NY origin** horses must be accompanied by a negative EIA test report. The date of sample collection for the qualifying EIA test must have been *on or after January 1*, 2023.
- Imported horses (out of state origin) must be accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection with a negative EIA test within 12 months prior to entry. Rabies vaccination information can be incorporated into the CVI.
- Drawing or photograph must match the horse.
- Rabies vaccination must be within 1 year of arrival at the fair and be documented
 by a **signed** rabies certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart with the
 required information (see requirements).

MOST IMPORTANT

When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork and official ID is present and legible. If they are showing any signs of illness, **LEAVE THEM HOME.**

BARN RULES for 2024

In order to maintain safety to all fair attendees, the Wayne County Fair Board of Directors has established the following Barn Rules.

- 1.
- Overnights in the Barn: -Absolutely No one under the age of 18 is allowed to stay/be in the barns without a Chaperone after 10 PM.
 - -ONLY exhibitors are allowed to stay/be in the barns overnight.
 - -Youth should be in the barns at the time listed in rule 2.
 - -This policy will be strictly enforced.
- 2. Barns will close at 10 PM and lights will be turned off at 11 PM.
- 3. NO ALCOHOL IS PERMITTED IN THE BARNS AT ANY TIME!!!
- 4. Cigarette smoking, cigar smoking and pipe smoking are prohibited at all times. This includes electronic smoking devices.
- 5. Manure is to be placed in or on the side of the dumpster where signs are placed. **NO MANURE** AND NO MILK is to be put in Garbage Totes. The disposal of milk should be done down the drains of the wash rack and washed down with water.
- 6. Do not move garbage totes from where they are placed. If one is filled, notify a superintendent.
- 7. The barn aisle and wash rack areas are to be kept free of grooming tools, equipment, hair and manure. Hoses should be coiled after use. PLEASE clean up after your animal. Keep outside of the barn clean and free of hay, straw, and manure.
- 8. For public safety, please use nearest exit for moving animals in and out of the barn.
- 9. Grooming Chutes must be stored outside and are only allowed inside the barn on show days. The chutes MUST not block the aisles.
- 10. Keep aisles clean Keep aisles free from garbage, straw and manure so spectators are able to walk freely through the barns. The aisles also serve as a fire lane and need to be kept open at **ALL** times for this reason.
- 11. Keep doorways open and free from tack, supplies, chairs, beds, etc. It is important to keep all fire lanes open in case of an emergency.
- 12. Wash Racks Please keep the wash racks clean. Manure, grain and water needs to freely flow down the drain. If there is an issue, please make the Livestock Superintendents aware of the situation. DO NOT continue to fill the rack and have it over flow. DO NOT REMOVE SCREWS AND OPEN DRAINS!!
- 13. Absolutely no running, shouting, cursing, ball playing or activity that could interfere with public safety is allowed.
- 14. Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH WEST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.

REMINDER

We support all laws pertaining to service animals, however if you have a service animal on the grounds during an event or the fair please inform us at the Main Office. We thank you for your assistance with this request. No "Pets" are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked.

If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds. These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal's protection as well as yours.

NO DOGS ON THE FAIR GROUNDS DURING ANY EVENT!!

Your cooperation in recognizing the importance of these rules, as well as adhering to them, is greatly appreciated. Any offense in breaking these rules could result in the removal of you and your animal(s) from the property and any premium money will be forfeited. These rules are for your protection as well as your animal(s) and the public.

- 5. Junior Get of Sire shall consist of three (3) animals, under 2 years of age from the same sire.
- 6. Produce of Dam shall consist of two (2) animals from the same mother.
- 7. Dairy herd shall consist of three (3) females, of any age, that have calved at least once.
- 8. Every exhibitor must file with the superintendent the Health Report and Registry Papers of all animals exhibited, before animals are unloaded. These will be returned by the superintendent at the close of the fair.
- 9. All hay, straw and grain must be furnished by the exhibitor.

A dry cow is any cow which is now dry and has completed at least one lactation. A dry cow can show in either the dry cow class or the appropriate age group. A milking cow can not be shown in the dry cow class.

- 11. Judging procedure will follow in numerical sequence in each respective breed.
- 12. Judging of classes will be alternated between breeds.
- 13. The Wayne County Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss, damage or accident to livestock, person or property from any cause while at the fairgrounds. Entries are received upon this condition only.

The showing of registered dairy cattle is an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the various dairy breed associations to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding registered dairy cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors. In this connection, The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association believes that it is in the best interest of the breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring. It recognizes that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle which are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the cataloging, handling, and presentation of cattle in the show ring which are unacceptable.

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the showing of registered dairy cattle:

- 3. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- 4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
- 5. Setting Teats.

The following practices and procedures are considered to detract from the image of the show ring when carried to excess and will be given slight to serious discrimination in placing animals within class.

- 1. Excessive manipulation of the hair.
- 2. Use of artificial hair except for false switches.
- 3. Unsportsmanlike conduct on part of showmen.
- 4. Improper fitting practices such as over filling and over bagging.

Practices which should be encouraged to enhance the image of the show:

- 1. Establish uniform dress code for exhibitors in the show ring.
- 2. Recognize good herdsmanship and exhibits in the barn.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of these policies are subject to disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and/or show management.

- 5. Critizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.

Exhibit Rules and Regulations

In an effort to maintain professional gallery practices, Wayne County Fair implements the following rules and regulations for its juried exhibits.

We ask that Artists and Art makers read and adhere to the rules and regulations, as The Wayne County Fair Domestics Department reserves the right to refuse submission to any Exhibit and will not accept artworks that do not comply to the stated rules and regulations.

Observing the following points ensures that your artwork will be exhibited in the best possible way.

Originality and Prints

All entries must be original works and not previously shown in a Wayne County Fair Department

Please be mindful of copyright infringements.

Copies and reproductions of original works of art, whether embellished or not, are not eligible for submission to exhibits. However, fine art prints such as photographs, lithographs, woodcuts, engravings, etchings, screen prints and digital works are acceptable as long as they are labeled as such and numbered as an edition.

Size

Maximum size for all artwork, is as follows:

Two-dimensional work, 2D, measurements are 48" in width and 48" in height.

Three dimensional work, 3D, measurements are 36" in circumference width 60" in height.

Two Dimensional Art and Framing

All works on paper, including photographs, must be framed. Glass and Plexiglas must be clean inside and out, unscratched and intact.

Works on canvas must be framed or have gallery-wrapped, finished edges with no staples visible.

Frames must be in good condition, free of scratches and loose corners.

Mats must be clean and smoothly cut.

A hanging wire must be firmly attached to the back with screw-eyes or D-rings, and the wire not exceeding the top of the frame.

2-D pieces with saw tooth hangers will not be accepted.

Dust covers or other backing material must be clean and intact.

Artwork must be completely dry at time of submission.

Three Dimensional Art

The Wayne County Fair is not accepting 3D art within Domestics Department Section 13 as of now. We are hoping to explore this option in the Future. Please stay tuned.

Withdrawal

Work accepted for an exhibition may not be substituted, nor will any artwork be withdrawn during any exhibition, in any circumstance.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition

All Entries will be reviewed at the time of submission to ensure adherence to the artwork condition rules and regulations of the exhibit.

Inclusion / Exclusion in the exhibit is at the sole discretion of the Juror (not connected with The Wayne County Fair and is non-negotiable). The Superintendent of the WCF Domestics Department and Wayne County Fir reviews artwork for adherence to the Wayne County Fair rules and regulations only and reserves the right to refuse submission based on the terms stated within.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition (continued)

The number of pieces included in the exhibit will depend upon the space available and the size of the artworks selected. On average, this will be between 10 and 20 pieces.

The Wayne County Fair reserves the right to turn away any submissions that it deems inappropriate for our younger viewers or offensive in subject matter.

Works with overtly pornographic, discriminatory or violent messages may be barred from submission per the Wayne County Fair Domestics Superintendent and/or Board of Directors.

Statement of Responsibility

All entries are left at the owner's risk—The Wayne County Fair is not responsible for any loss or damage to submitted artwork by any means whatsoever.

The Wayne County Fair employees, staff, and volunteers will take all necessary precaution in handling artwork.

Awards

Three cash awards are given for each show: 1st Prize is \$100, 2nd Prize is \$75 and 3rd Prize is \$50

Fees

All exhibitions require a non-refundable entry fee for each submission. \$10 per entry and artists may submit up to three images.

Sales

All artwork on exhibit must be For sale.

All artwork sold in exhibitions at The Wayne County Fair are subject to a 30 % commission fee held by The Wayne County Fair. Artists receive 70% of the listed sales price of any artwork sold through exhibitions.

In order to receive payment for sold artwork, artists must Submit Entry Forms into the Wayne County Fairs Secretary's office, and hold an Exhibitors number which must be received on day of entry due. (August 8th, 2020, Due with Domestics Department Entries)

Payments for sold artwork are not processed until the exhibition has closed. Payments for artwork sold in any exhibition must be processed before 1pm Sunday August 20th 2024 before the secretary & Treasurers office is closed. This is also the time of Artwork Pickup.

The Superintendent of the WCF Domestics Department will be notify Artists of the sale if art and be called or sent an email.

Pick-Up of Artwork

Artwork must be picked up on Sunday August 20th between 8am -3pm. There is a one week grace period for late pick-up, last chance for pick up for ONLY SECTION 13 is Sunday August 27th. Anyone who has not picked up their work after the specified pick-up day is subject to an assessed a storage fee.

Artwork that has not been picked up after 30 Days of the Exhibition Closure, becomes the property of The Wayne County Fair.

Miscellaneous

The Wayne County Fair Domestics Superintendent must review and approve in advance, any unconventional methods of display or hanging presentation.

Once an accepted piece of artwork is installed in a show, no requests for moving any art pieces, or to change the location of any art pieces, will be considered or accepted.

Placement and position of art in any Exhibit is up to the discretion of the Director and Staff of The Wayne County Fair to place and to hang artwork. If there are requests and directions, in regard to any piece of art entered to an Exhibition, please supply and furnish those requests upon the art submission and delivery.

How the Mullet & Facial hair-dos will be Judged:



Size (20 Points)

The overall length, width, girth and density (fullness) of the hair. Beards are measured from the bottom of the lip to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched). Mullets are measured

Mustaches must stop at the corner of the mouth. Mustaches growing below the corner of the mouth will be considered partial beard.

Quality (15 Points)

The graduation, taper, angle and thickness of individual hair follicles; the precise grooming (fly away hairs), sheen and symmetry of the hair style.

Style & Presentation (30 Points)

Does the facial hair fit the individual? Does the Mullet style fit the individual? Does it compliment the individuals overall style? These are considerations for the judges. How is the wearer of the facial hair's attitude, attention to the crowd, attire or overall look.

Dazzle (25 Points):

During the day of competition you may earn up to 25 more points through dazzle, how you portray yourself and hairstyle. Through Costume, and stage presence. The judges will be looking for individuals whose hairstyle reflects their hairs personality, individuals personality and costumes personality. Come dressed and ready to dazzle yourself across stage!

Audience Particiation (10 Points):

Strut your stuff, show your hairittude! Your 30 second stage walk can make or break you here! Hair flips and stare downs encouraged! Lets see what you got!

Each competitor has the opportunity to earn up to 100 Points total, the highest points will win in each category, and be places 1st - 4th place. Ties will be Determined during the competition by stage presence and audience help!

Hair-do Definitions for Competitor Reference:





Mullet: is a hairstyle in which the hair is cut short at the front and sides, but left long at the back. Mullets are measured from the bottom of the ear lobe to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched).



Full Beard under 6": Full beard as it grows and left natural, no longer than 6" (15 cm) below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better. The mustache may not be highlighted, and the beard may not be tucked under at the bottom. No styling aids allowed.

Full Beard Free Styled: Full beard as it grows and left natural, longer than 6" below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better.



Alaskan Whaler: Bushy hair grown along the jaw, chin and lower lip, and optionally on the cheeks. No hair grown on upper lip.

Common styles include:

Alaskan Whaler (hair on cheeks) Amish (trimmed cheeks) Donegal (trimmed down to jawline)



Goatee: As it grows naturally, the more natural the better. Moustache not required. Goatee and Moustache can be accentuated but without styling aids. No curled Mustaches. There must be a clean shaven section at least 1.5" (4 cm, the width of a razor blade) between the onset of the head hair and the beard.




Chops/ Sideburns: (With a break Somewhere Beard) Must be a true side-burn, with no natural or shaven gap below the ear. Chin is shaven and hair is optional on the upper lip.

Common styles include:


Classic Sideburns (trimmed short)

Muttonchops (sideburns grown out at length)

Friendly Muttonchops (sideburns grown at length, connected with a Moustache)




Partial Beard: A partial beard is any facial hair that is neither a full beard nor a mustache. Natural or shaven gaps define the different styles.





Common styles include: Natural Goatee (chin only) Van Dyke (connected mustache and chin beard)

Triple Point/Musketeer (mustache with narrow, pointed chin beard)




Moustache: A Moustache is composed of facial hair above the upper lip. At International contests, it is agreed that Moustache hairs can start growing from up to a maximum of 5/8" (1.5 cm) beyond the end of the upper lip.



Moustache Natural: A natural Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, with no styling products permitted. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.



Moustache: Freestyle: A styled Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, styled with product. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.

4 – THREE POUND CANS OF CRISCO; ONE 35-FOOT, 10-INCH DIAMETER FRESHLY CUT AND FRESHLY PEELED PINE POLE. THE POLE SHOULD BE SET FIVE FEET INTO THE GROUND. THE TOTAL CLIMBING DISTANCE WILL BE 30 FEET. TABLE AND CHAIR FOR REGISTRATION; FOUR TIMING WATCHES; MINIMUM OF TWO TIMERS; TWO POLE SPOTTERS AT THE BASE OF THE POLE; ONE JUDGE; AN EMCEE; ONE SOUND SYSTEM; AND A REGISTRAR TO REGISTER THE TEAMS.

- 1. PLAYING FIELD: A CLEARED AREA 20 FEET IN RADIUS WILL BE MARKED OFF IN A CIRCLE AROUND THE POLE. ROPE WILL BE USED AS THE MARKING AGE T. THE JUDGE WILL BE INSTRUCTED TO STOP COMPETITION IF SPECTATORS CROWD THE LINE.
- 2. TEAMS: THE MINIMUM AGE OF COMPETITION IS 18 YEARS. PHOTO ID MUST BE DIS-PLAYED TO HEAD JUDGE UPON REGISTERING. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 3. TEAMS WILL BE LIMITED TO 5 PERSONS PER TEAM.
- 4. TEAM CAPTAIN WILL PRE-REGISTER ALL PERSONS ON HIS TEAM. PRE-REGISTRATION WILL BEGIN AT 6:30PM ON THE FAIRGROUNDS IN FRONT OF FLORAL HALL WEST SIDE OF MAIN GATE.
- 5. EACH TEAM CAPTAIN WILL DRAW FOR POSITION.
