REMINDER

We support all laws pertaining to service animals, however if you have a service animal on the grounds during an event or the fair please inform us at the Main Office.

We thank you for your assistance with this request.

No "Pets" are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked. If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds.

These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal's protection as well as yours.



RULES AND REGULATIONS Exhibitor Rules

- 1. Articles not listed in this book will not be accepted for entry.
- 2. No premium will be paid upon any entry not made at the Secretary's Office.
- 3. All entries are entered and shown at the risk of the owner. The Union Agricultural Society at Palmyra will not be responsible in case of fire, theft, accidental or providential damage or destruction. Precautions will be taken, and experienced superintendents will be in charge of each show.
- 4. The Association reserves the right to substitute a judge at any time it deems necessary.
- 5. Livestock showing any signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the grounds at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
- 6. All entries are final. Payment of an entry fee signifies compliance with the rules set forth in this catalog.

NEW •

- 7. Any changes within ANY entries AFTER Saturday, August 2nd 2025 MUST be brought to the attention of the Secretary prior to Monday August 4th by NOON OR Thursday August 7th by 9AM (FOR DEPARTMENT 02-01- DAIRY CATTLE ONLY). This includes changing of ANY entry even if it FALLS WITHIN THE SAME EXACT CLASS. EVEN MORE IMPORTANT IF IT IS A DIFFERENT CLASS.
- 7A. In regard to rule 7. Transferring of entry fees from one entry to another or exchanging one entry for another due to a change in entry type/department/section/or class **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AFTER Monday August 4th by NOON.**
- 7B. ANY CHANGES IN ENTRIES AFTER THE DATES AND TIMES LISTED ABOVE WILL RESULT IN A LATE ENTRY FEE AS WELL AS A "NEW ENTRY" ENTRY FEE. AND MUST BE PAID TO THE SECRETARYS OFFICE PROIOR TO JUDGING OF ENTRIES LISTED AS CHANGED OR NEW FROM EXHIBITOR.
- 7C. Entry Removal: Removing an official entry after Saturday, August 2ND will result in the entry fee being donated to the Palmyra Agriculture Society A.K.A Wayne County Fair. Entry Fees Are NO LONGER TRANSFERABLE OR REFUNDED AFTER SAID DATE LISTED.
- 7D. Writing Checks: **There will be a Bounced Check Fee of \$25.00** Per Bounced Check plus the late Entry fee of that class and actual entry fee of that entry Item. For Any Bounced Checks that come through ANY of the Wayne County Fair Offices.

PLEASE NOTE < **** The secretary is ALWAYS in Domestics from 8am- 5pm on Saturday, August 2ND***

- 8. The Wayne County Fair will not be responsible for special awards offered by anyone other than the Association.
- 9. No interference between exhibitor and judge will be allowed.

10. Except as noted in Department Rules, NO EXHIBIT, OPEN or 4-H Division, many be removed from the grounds **PRIOR to 6:00 PM, Sunday, August 10, 2025.(or Premium Monies Will Be FORFEITED).**

11. Good check, cash, or money order accepted in payment of entry fees.

REMINDER

12. Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH WEST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.

There are basically two systems of judging that are commonly used in fair judging, the American System and the Danish System. Check with the superintendent or agent in charge before you begin judging to clarify which system you will be using and how many placings you will be required to make.

AMERICAN STYLE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the American System of Judging, each exhibit is judged not only on its own merit, but in comparison to other exhibits using score cards prepared by the IAFE & State Division of Fairs and Expositions, and Fair Management. This system is used throughout all the divisions of the Fair, unless otherwise indicated, for awards and ribbons.Generally a "closed" judging system.

Departments that use this system: Departments 5-8-9-10-12a&b-13

DANISH STYLE JUDGING SYSTEM

In this system all exhibitors receive a ribbon. All exhibits are grouped according to quality, and there may be multiple entries that get the same ranking and ribbon. Quality may vary from excellent to fair, and ribbon categories may be blue, red, white and/or yellow. In this system of judging, exhibits are not in competition with or compared to each other.

There is no formula to determine the number of ribbons to be given in the Danish System. Quality determines the ranking for blue, red, white and/or yellow ribbon. A blue ribbon is generally recognized and used for excellence. Red ribbons are given for an adequate exhibit that does not meet all the standards. White and/oryellow ribbons are given when the exhibit is below standard quality and improvement is definitely needed. Under the Danish system, participation ribbons are given to recognize the efforts of the exhibitor.

Departments that use this system:

CONFERENCE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the Conference System of Judging, means that the entire group of exhibitors for a specific lot number meets with the judge, and the judge briefly discusses each exhibit with exhibitors. The judge will place each exhibit comparing it to the standard of perfection and the quality of the other exhibits according to the Danish system.

Departments that use this system: 4-H, Showmanship, some Open Livestock dpts.

FACE TO FACE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the Face to Face System of Judging, means that the exhibitor must be present at the time of judging and talk to the judge about his/her entry. This system is used for the Cloverbud and Exploring departments, and is designed to make the judging experience a positive learning experience for the young exhibitor.

Departments that use this system: 4-H, Showmanship, Open Livestock, Contests

Listed below are some points of interest that influence judges using the score cards as their guidelines:

Appearance Condition of Work Color Harmony Plant Quality Execution of the Work

Suitability of Materials Flavor, Texture (Foods) Accuracy of Design Reproduction

Types of Judging

There are two types of judging commonly used in county fairs and competitive events – open judging and closed judging.

Open judging is an open assessment by the judge before a group about the items in the exhibit. The exhibitors may be present. All exhibitors benefit from the discussion in open judging, although extra care must be taken so that the judge's comments do not embarrass exhibitors or cause unnecessarily hurt feelings.

Closed judging is done in a private area, where only the officials are allowed until the judging is completed. This is usually done when there are a large number of items in the exhibit, and/or when there is not enough room for spectators to listen to open judging. The judging is conducted prior to the opening of the event.

In some judging situations, score sheets are provided for judges to record comments for the exhibitor about the qualities desired and standards used for judging.

Remember, the most important thing is how YOU feel about your project and what you've learned. If you did your best, you can be proud of yourself and the experience you gained!

If you have a question about the judging of your department please ask your superintendent or the Fair secretary.

Exhibitor Pre-fair Guidelines

Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas and Alpacas, Cervids, Misc. Ruminants

- Review the animal health requirements booklet including information for your species **before** your veterinarian arrives to inspect your animals. If you have any questions, **ask.**
- Your veterinarian is responsible for inspecting your animals and completing the certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI). Call **early** to avoid the last-minute rush when mistakes are made and there is no time to correct.
- Make sure **USDA approved official ear tags** are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats. Official ID must be applied to animals prior to regulatory testing and completion of the CVI.
- Llamas and alpacas require a microchip or ear tag. If a microchip is utilized make sure the veterinarian confirms the microchip ID or places one. If your animal is identified by a microchip, make sure you bring a working reader with you to the fair.
- ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE RECORDED. Make sure it is.
- Review the CVI carefully upon receipt to make sure all the information is correct including any required test or vaccination information.
- **DO NOT** stuff it in an envelope and assume all is well. The time to correct is before pulling them out at the fair. The CVI is your document, and you share responsibility if it is incorrect.
- If you are **importing** livestock from out of state, make sure the interstate requirements are met and you have a valid **interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.**

Poultry

- If your flock is participating in the NPIP program, schedule pullorum flock inspection and testing well ahead of the fair.
- If you're having your birds tested within 90 days of the fair, you must go to a pullorum clinic. Available clinics are listed on the Dept. website. No individual testing is available if you miss a clinic.
- Birds qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- **Bring documentation** with you to the fair in the form of a 1) current NPIP certificate, 2) 90-day test chart or 3) purchase receipt with NPIP certification within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

<u>Horses</u>

- **NY origin** horses must be accompanied by a negative EIA test report. The date of sample collection for the qualifying EIA test must have been *on or after January 1, 2023.*
- Imported horses (out of state origin) must be accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection with a negative EIA test within 12 months prior to entry. Rabies vaccination information can be incorporated into the CVI.
- Drawing or photograph **must** match the horse.
- Rabies vaccination must be within 1 year of arrival at the fair and be documented by a **signed** rabies certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart with the required information (see requirements).

MOST IMPORTANT

When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork and official ID is present and legible. If they are showing any signs of illness, **LEAVE THEM HOME.**

2025 INTERSTATE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIR ANIMALS

This document is a supplement to the Animal Health Requirements (AI-202) published for animals exhibited at New York county fairs and the Great New York State Fair. Its purpose is to **summarize** the import requirements that must be met for livestock entering New York destined for fairs. <u>Please carefully review the Animal Health Requirements (AI-202)</u>. Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination in species not required by the state. Contact the specific fair for their requirements. Fair contact information is available at **www.nyfairs.org**. EMERGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS

Due to the ongoing Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) outbreak in both cattle and poultry, there are emergency import regulations and test requirements in effect. In addition, there are federal orders for dairy cattle in effect. These emergency conditions and test requirements must be met in addition to the Part 351 fair requirements to be admitted to the Great New York State and county fairs. These conditions may change at any time. It is STRONGLY recommended that you frequently review these regulations and federal orders for both poultry and cattle at our website:

INTERSTATE CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (ICVI)

An interstate CVI is required for cattle, horses, swine, sheep, goats, llamas/alpacas, deer/elk and misc. ruminants moving interstate. Extended Equine CVIs (EECVIs) are acceptable for horses. Note that interstate CVI's must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian.

A printed copy of the ICVI must be presented for animal check-in.

The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season, from July 1 through Labor Day, interstate CVI's can be used multiple times as long as the initial entrance to a NY fair is within 30 days of CVI inspection and the CVI is initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official at the fair. Once the CVI has been initialed, it can be used for the rest of the fair season if no health issues arise. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI. All documentation must accompany the animals. Animals not meeting the interstate and/or fair and any applicable emergency import requirements will not be allowed on the grounds. Individual official ID is required on all animals. Animals with incomplete or illegible ID will be rejected. Required rabies vaccination may be included on the health certificate.

HORSES

Horses can enter with a CVI. Horses 6 months of age or older must test negative for equine infectious anemia (EIA). The sample collection date for the **qualifying EIA test must be within 12 months prior to the date of entry to the fair**. The horse must be clearly and completely identified. Rabies vaccination is required for all horses 4 months of age and older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months.

CATTLE - SEE EMERGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS ABOVE

All cattle must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) eartag, commonly referred to as an "840 RFID tag" or equivalent official RFID tag if the animal was tagged in another country.

All lactating dairy cattle must test negative for HPAI within seven (7) days prior to entering a fair or exhibition, including the New York State Fair, county fairs, or other exhibitions. The test must be conducted at a National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) lab.

Cattle from all states must be test negative for BVD-PI with results and test date noted on the CVI. For cattle from the New England states, New Jersey, Ohio and Pennsylvania, no additional testing (other than the BVD-PI test and HPAI test for lactating dairy cattle) is required. For information on other states, you can contact DAI at 518-457-3971 or check the Department website at <u>https://agriculture.ny.gov/animals/animal-import-export</u>.

Vaccination for rabies is required for all cattle 4 months of age or older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months. Bovine respiratory disease complex vaccination is also required. Vaccinations must be documented.

<u>SHEEP</u>

Sheep can enter with CVI. All sheep must be identified by one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> flock tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the sheep is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program, and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the sheep's registration paper. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824). The veterinary statement certifying the flock of origin was inspected with no evidence of contagious disease in the flock at the time of inspection is required.

Rabies vaccination is required for all sheep 4 months of age and older on the date of admission to a fair. Vaccination must be within the past 12 months unless a 3- year vaccination has been used. No regulatory tests are required for sheep.

<u>GOATS</u>

Goats can enter with CVI. All goats must be identified by one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the goat's registration paper. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824). The veterinary statement certifying the herd of origin was inspected with no evidence of contagious disease in the herd at the time of inspection is required. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination*. No regulatory tests are required for goats.

<u>SWINE</u>

Swine can enter with CVI only. Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.* No regulatory tests are required for swine.

LLAMAS / ALPACAS

New world camelids attending a New York county or state fair must be accompanied by a CVI with animals individually identified by microchip or official ear tag. They must be test negative for BVD-PI with test date and results noted on the CVI. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.*

DEER/ELK (CERVIDAE)

CWD susceptible cervid species cannot be imported into New York. Non CWD susceptible species require a permit, CVI and proper identification. Prior to importing deer, contact the Cervid Program Manager at 518-457-3502.

POULTRY – SEE EMEGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS ABOVE

Negative avian influenza and pullorum status is required for all poultry entering NY. Out of state poultry must be accompanied by the NPIP flock certificate if the flock is NPIP certified. Otherwise, a CVI is required. Poultry, with the exception of, doves and pigeons, must test negative for pullorum within 90 days prior to importation, if not from an NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock. In addition, all poultry must be 1) from a source flock in which 30 birds were tested negative for avian influenza within ten days prior to entry into New York State; or 2) from an NPIP U.S. H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean or NPIP U.S. Avian Influenza Clean Flock. For more information, contact DAI at 518-457-3971.

MISC. RUMINANTS

Certificate of veterinary inspection and official USDA approved ear tag. *Note that individual county fairs may require rabies vaccination.*



Emergency Animal Disease Regulations for 2025

NYS State and County Fairs

Date: January 31, 2025 (subject to change, check back regularly at website below)

Due to the ongoing Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) outbreak in both cattle and poultry, there are emergency import regulations in effect. In addition, there are federal orders for dairy cattle in effect. Regardless of residency, any emergency conditions and testing requirements must be <u>met in addition to</u> the Part 351 fair requirements to be admitted to the Great New York State and county fairs. These conditions may change at any time. It is STRONGLY recommended that you frequently review these regulations and federal orders at our website:

DAIRY CATTLE: (Out of state)

A. Emergency Import Requirements

The Department has issued new import requirements for <u>dairy cattle</u> coming into New York (<u>https://agriculture.ny.gov/animals/animal-import-export</u>).

- Importation of dairy cattle from a premises with a confirmed case of HPAI or a premises under investigation as a suspect premises is **prohibited**; and
- Dairy cattle imported from affected states must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within **10 days prior to entry** into the state; and
- CVIs issued for dairy cattle from affected states must include the statement: "All animals identified on the Certificate of Veterinary (CVI) have been examined and do not originate from a premises with a confirmed detection of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza, or that is currently under investigation as a suspect premises."
- Non-lactating dairy cattle > 18 months of age imported from states that have had a confirmed case of HPAI in cattle (within the last 30 days):
 - Must have a negative Influenza A test (nasal swab/PCR) within 10 days prior to entry. The date of test and test result must be written on the CVI.
 - Must be tested individually. If they are moving as a group or lot, the maximum number to test is 30.



- Must be accompanied by a copy of the laboratory report. The report shall be retained by the destination facility for 3 months.
- USDA APHIS has additional restrictions for interstate movement of lactating dairy cattle which can be <u>found here</u>.
- B. All lactating dairy cattle must be tested for HPAI before entering NY fairs or exhibitions.
 - All lactating dairy cattle must test negative for HPAI within seven (7) days prior to entering a fair or exhibition, including the New York State Fair, county fairs, or other exhibitions. The test must be conducted at a National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) lab. Individual animal test is required.

DAIRY CATTLE: (In state)

A. All lactating dairy cattle must be tested for HPAI before entering NY fairs or exhibitions.

 All lactating dairy cattle must test negative for HPAI within seven (7) days prior to entering a fair or exhibition, including the New York State Fair, county fairs, or other exhibitions. The test must be conducted at a National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) lab. Individual animal test is required.

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EMERGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS

Due to the ongoing Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) outbreak in both cattle and poultry, there are emergency import regulations in effect. In addition, there are federal orders for dairy cattle in effect. Regardless of residency, there are HPAI test requirements for any lactating dairy cow also in effect for New York fairs and exhibitions. These emergency conditions must be met in addition to the Part 351 fair requirements to be admitted to the Great NY State and county fairs. These conditions may change at any time. It is STRONGLY recommended that you frequently review these regulations and federal orders for both poultry and cattle at our website: https://agriculture.ny.gov/farming/fairs



General Prohibitions and Requirements

- No person shall bring or have present an animal on the fairgrounds for any reason (show, exhibit, raffle, demonstration, display) during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.
- Any animal which is subject to inspection upon entry to the fairgrounds will be inspected without covering (wraps, coats, head gear, etc.).
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.
- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to, or require removal from, the fair premises or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of, or exposed to, any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease.
 <u>NOTE</u>: The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious, or communicable disease (Part 350.10). The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring

questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.

 All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- Cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, deer, and misc. ruminants require a valid CVI to enter the fairgrounds.
- The CVI must be issued by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. Wet ink signatures for paper CVIs or e-signature for eCVIs are acceptable.
- A physical CVI must be available to inspection staff for date and approval at time of inspection. This may be a printout of an eCVI or owner's copy of a paper CVI.
- All animals must be officially identified. **ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED.** Refer to Animal Identification section below for more information.
- Only one species is allowed per certificate.
- The type and duration of certificate required depends on the origin of the livestock.

New York Origin Livestock:

- A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required.
- Each animal must be individually identified on the CVI (see below).
- The CVI must be issued on or after May 1 of the current year.

Out of State Origin Livestock:

- All animals entering New York State must satisfy import health and test requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- An e-CVI may be issued but a paper copy of the e-CVI is required for the animal check-in process.
- The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVI's can be used multiple times for entrance into fairs. The initial entrance into a NY fair must be within 30 days of the



date of CVI inspection. For the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official noting the location of the initial fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

Animal Identification

- ALL MANMADE ID MUST BE RECORDED
- All cattle must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) eartag, commonly referred to as an "840 RFID tag" or equivalent official RFID tag if the animal was tagged in another country.
- Sheep and goats must be identified by official scrapie identification (see sheep and goat sections below).
- Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended. Nursing piglets originating within NYS do not have to be individually identified if the sow is correctly identified on the CVI and the number of piglets in the litter is noted on the CVI. Nursing piglets from out of state will need official ID (see swine section).
- Llamas and alpacas must be identified by official ear tag or microchip.
- Misc. ruminants must be identified by unique ear tag or microchip.
- A complete written description is sufficient identification for horses entering New York accompanied by a CVI. The description must match the EIA test record. Horse sketches and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars, and other markings as necessary to uniquely identify the horse. Tattoos and microchips, if any, should be included. "Bay, no markings" is not an acceptable description for a CVI or EIA test record.
- <u>NOTE</u>: If you are exhibiting animals identified by microchip, a working reader must be supplied by the exhibitor.
- For questions on animal identification please contact your veterinarian or our office at 518-457-3502.

Rabies Vaccination

- Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) **and** that are *4 months of age or older* on the date of admission to the fair.
 - For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds.
- Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The exception is Imrab LA vaccine used in sheep which protects for 3 years after the second annual vaccination (consult your veterinarian).



- The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- <u>NOTE</u>: Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors. The <u>New York State Fair</u> requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds.

Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the veterinarian administering the vaccine to said described animal(s) or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration, and the duration of immunity if longer than one year (sheep only).
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on a paper EIA test record, the test record must be signed certifying vaccination in addition to the required signature for the EIA test record.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is electronically entered into an eEIA test record, only one electronic signature is required.
- <u>NOTE</u>: Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements. A veterinary clinic invoice may not be sufficient proof of rabies vaccination.
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid rabies vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

HPAI Testing for Lactating Dairy Cattle

• All lactating dairy cattle must test negative for HPAI within seven (7) days prior to entering a fair or exhibition, including the New York State Fair, county fairs, or other exhibitions. The test must be conducted at a National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN) lab.

BVD-PI Testing

 All cattle, llamas, and alpacas exhibited at NY county fairs, or the State Fair must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect **Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI)**. Official ID must be in the animal prior to sampling. The testing veterinarian is responsible to make sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, official identification of the animal, and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test or official identification is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

Cleaning and Disinfection

• All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).



Animal Deaths

• Occasionally animal deaths occur at a fair. If a death occurs, it must be reported to the state veterinarian in charge as soon as possible for review. The animal must be promptly removed from the public exhibit area to a secure location and held for the veterinarian prior to disposal.

Calving, Kidding, and Lambing

• Any cattle, goats, or sheep that calve, kid, or lamb while at a county fair or the State Fair will be **ordered removed from the fairgrounds** along with their offspring, unless the animals are part of a birthing demonstration.

Commingling of Sheep and Cattle

• Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is strongly recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

Commingling of Swine and Poultry

• Due to the potential spread of influenza virus, it is recommended that swine and poultry be housed in separate locations.

Isolation on Returning Home

• The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin. If any illness is noted in the exhibition animals, the owner should contact their veterinarian immediately.

Individual Species Requirements

<u>Horses</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is <u>not</u> required for New York origin horses. CVI is required for imported horses. Extended Equine CVIs (EECVIs) are acceptable.
- Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test is required for all horses 6 months
 of age or older. The horse must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test
 record, signed by a Category 2 accredited veterinarian. The sample collection date
 for the qualifying EIA test must have been on or after January 1, 2024, for New
 York origin horses. For imported horses, the EIA test must have been conducted
 within 12 months prior to entry. The EIA test certificate must include a complete
 description of the horse.
- Rabies vaccination within 12 months is required for all horses 4 months of age or older (see above).





- See EMERGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS SECTION AT THE TOP.
- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- All lactating dairy cattle must have tested negative to HPAI test within 7 days prior to entry to a New York fair or exhibition. See "HPAI Testing for Lactating Dairy Cattle" section above.
- Rabies vaccination is required for all cattle 4 months of age or older (see above).
- All cattle must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- All cattle must be vaccinated against bovine respiratory disease complex including bovine respiratory syncytial virus, bovine virus diarrhea, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and parainfluenza with an age appropriate- product administered in a manner and time frame adequate to confer protective immunity for these diseases for the duration of the fair. The date and vaccine product should be documented.

<u>Sheep</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> flock tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the sheep is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program, and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the sheep's registration paper. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- Rabies vaccination is required for all sheep 4 months of age or older (see above).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the flock of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.
- If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any sheep, the entire exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

<u>Goats</u>

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals individually identified with USDA approved scrapie identification. Identification must be one of the following: 1) USDA approved tags or 2) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> registration tattoo or 3) a legible <u>USDA approved</u> herd tattoo and individual animal ID number or 4) electronic implant device (microchip) if the goat is enrolled in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program and/or the electronic implant ID is recorded on the goat's registration paper. For information on scrapie ID, contact USDA at 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
- The CVI must contain a written statement from the issuing Category 2 accredited veterinarian that the herd of origin was inspected after May 1 of the current year and no evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases was found.



 If evidence of sore mouth (contagious ecthyma) is found on any goat, the entire exhibit including the affected animals (and any small ruminants from any other flock on the same conveyance to the fairgrounds) shall immediately be removed from the fair premises with the holding pens cleaned and disinfected immediately after removal.

<u>Swine</u>

• Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. Out of state nursing piglets need official identification along with the sow. See Animal Identification section above.

Llamas and Alpacas

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above.
- All llamas and alpacas must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI). The existing, official identification, date and results of the testing must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Poultry

- SEE EMERGENCY DISEASE REQUIREMENTS SECTION AT THE TOP.
- Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons, and waterfowl) must be accompanied by 1) results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition <u>OR</u> 2) proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock.
- Poultry qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- Proof of NPIP status must be in the form of an NPIP certificate or purchase receipt containing NPIP certification information. If utilizing a receipt, it must be dated within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Deer/Elk (Cervidae)

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and a movement permit with animals properly identified.
- Regardless of residency of animals, please contact the Cervid Program Manager at the Division of Animal Industry at 518-457-3502 prior to movement.

Miscellaneous Ruminants

• Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with animals properly identified. See Animal Identification section above. <u>Only one species per Certificate of Veterinary</u> Inspection.



Exhibitor Pre-fair Guidelines

Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas, and Alpacas, Cervids, Misc. Ruminants

- Review the animal health requirements booklet including information for your species **before** your veterinarian arrives to inspect your animals. If you have any questions, **ask**.
- Your veterinarian is responsible for inspecting your animals and completing the certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI). Call **early** to avoid the last-minute rush when mistakes are made and there is no time to correct.
- Make sure **USDA approved official ear tags** are present on cattle and swine and USDA approved scrapie ID is in place on sheep and goats. Official ID must be applied to animals prior to regulatory testing and completion of the CVI.
- Llamas and alpacas require a microchip or ear tag. If a microchip is utilized make sure the veterinarian confirms the microchip ID or places one. If your animal is identified by a microchip, make sure you bring a working reader with you to the fair.
- ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE RECORDED. Make sure it is.
- Review the CVI carefully upon receipt to make sure all the information is correct including any required test or vaccination information.
- **DO NOT** put documents in an envelope and assume all is well. The time to correct is before pulling them out at the fair. The CVI is your document, and you share responsibility if it is incorrect.
- If you are **importing** livestock from out of state, make sure the interstate requirements are met, and you have a valid **interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.**

Poultry

- If your flock is participating in the NPIP program, schedule pullorum flock inspection and testing well ahead of the fair.
- If you're having your birds tested within 90 days of the fair, you must go to a pullorum clinic. Available clinics are listed on the Dept. website. No individual testing is available if you miss a clinic.
- Birds qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- **Bring documentation** with you to the fair in the form of a 1) current NPIP certificate, 2) 90-day test chart or 3) purchase receipt with NPIP certification within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

Horses

- **NY origin** horses must be accompanied by a negative EIA test report. The date of sample collection for the qualifying EIA test must have been *on or after January 1, 2024.*
- Imported horses (out of state origin) must be accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection with a negative EIA test within 12



months prior to entry. Rabies vaccination information can be incorporated into the CVI.

- Drawing or photograph **must** match the horse.
- Rabies vaccination must be within 1 year of arrival at the fair and be documented by a **signed** rabies certificate or a signed statement on the EIA test chart with the required information (see requirements).

MOST IMPORTANT

When you are loading your livestock for the trip to the fair, take the time to examine them. Make sure they are the same animals that are on the paperwork and official ID is present and legible. If they are showing any signs of illness, **LEAVE THEM HOME.**

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BARN RULES for 2025

In order to maintain safety to all fair attendees, the Wayne County Fair Board of Directors has established the following Barn Rules.

1. Overnights in the Barn: -Absolutely No one under the age of 18 is allowed to stay/be in the barns without a Chaperone after 10 PM.

-ONLY exhibitors are allowed to stay/be in the barns overnight.

-Youth should be in the barns at the time listed in rule 2.

-This policy will be strictly enforced.

2. Barns will close at 10 PM and lights will be turned off at 11 PM.

3. NO ALCOHOL IS PERMITTED IN THE BARNS AT ANY TIME!!!

- 4. Cigarette smoking, cigar smoking and pipe smoking are prohibited at all times. This includes electronic smoking devices.
- 5. Manure is to be placed in or on the side of the dumpster where signs are placed. **NO MANURE AND NO MILK is to be put in Garbage Totes.** The disposal of milk should be done down the drains of the wash rack and washed down with water.
- 6. Do not move garbage totes from where they are placed. If one is filled, notify a superintendent.
- 7. The barn aisle and wash rack areas are to be kept free of grooming tools, equipment, hair and manure. Hoses should be coiled after use. PLEASE clean up after your animal. Keep outside of the barn clean and free of hay, straw, and manure.
- 8. For public safety, please use nearest exit for moving animals in and out of the barn.
- 9. Grooming Chutes must be stored outside and are only allowed inside the barn on show days. The chutes MUST not block the aisles.
- 10. Keep aisles clean Keep aisles free from garbage, straw and manure so spectators are able to walk freely through the barns. The aisles also serve as a fire lane and need to be kept open at **ALL** times for this reason.
- 11. Keep doorways open and free from tack, supplies, chairs, beds, etc. It is important to keep all fire lanes open in case of an emergency.
- 12. Wash Racks Please keep the wash racks clean. Manure, grain and water needs to freely flow down the drain. If there is an issue, please make the Livestock Superintendents aware of the situation. DO NOT continue to fill the rack and have it over flow. DO NOT REMOVE SCREWS AND OPEN DRAINS!!
- 13. Absolutely no running, shouting, cursing, ball playing or activity that could interfere with public safety is allowed.
- 14. Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH WEST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.

REMINDER

We support all laws pertaining to service animals, however if you have a service animal on the grounds during an event or the fair please inform us at the Main Office. We thank you for your assistance with this request. No "Pets" are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked.

If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds. These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal's protection as well as yours.

NO DOGS ON THE FAIR GROUNDS DURING ANY EVENT!!

Your cooperation in recognizing the importance of these rules, as well as adhering to them, is greatly appreciated. Any offense in breaking these rules could result in the removal of you and your animal(s) from the property and any premium money will be forfeited. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the various dairy breed associations to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding registered dairy cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors. In this connection, The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association believes that it is in the best interest of the breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring. It recognizes that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle which are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the cataloging, handling, and presentation of cattle in the show ring which are unacceptable.

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the showing of registered dairy cattle:

- 3. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- 4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
- 5. Setting Teats.

The following practices and procedures are considered to detract from the image of the show ring when carried to excess and will be given slight to serious discrimination in placing animals within class.

- 1. Excessive manipulation of the hair.
- 2. Use of artificial hair except for false switches.
- 3. Unsportsmanlike conduct on part of showmen.
- 4. Improper fitting practices such as over filling and over bagging.

Practices which should be encouraged to enhance the image of the show:

- 1. Establish uniform dress code for exhibitors in the show ring.
- 2. Recognize good herdsmanship and exhibits in the barn.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of these policies are subject to disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and/or show management.

- 3. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally, with an irritant or counter-irritant, or other substance to artificially improve the conformation.
- 4. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- 5. Critizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.

The following practices and procedures are considered to detract from the image of the show ring when carried to excess and will be given slight to serious discrimination in placing animals within class.

Any exhibitor detected in changing ear labels falsely, misrepresenting ownership or guilty of other infractions of the rules will be excluded from competition and awards.
- 3. The name and registration number of each animal must be given at time of entry.
- 4. Departure before set time results in premium forfeiture.
- 5. ANY ANIMAL IN ANY CLASS MUST BE WORTHY OF RECOGNITION OR IT WILL BE ELIMINATED FROM THE COMPETITION. Only purebred sheep shall be eligible to compete in Sections 1-7 inclusive. Certificate of registration must be shown.
- 6. All animals exhibited must be free from scab or fungus infection. Animals from a flock under quarantine cannot be shown.

- 2. All fruits must be plainly labeled with the variety by the exhibitor.
- 3. A plate of fruit in all Plate exhibits shall consist of the following number of specimens:

Five (5) apples, pears, peaches; Twelve (12) plums, crabapples; and Three (3) clusters of grapes.

- 4. A Diamond shall consist of **Sixteen (16) specimens.**
- 5. All exhibits entered in this department shall become the property of the Palmyra Union Agricultural Society unless prior arrangements are made with the department superintendent. If so, "Hold" must be written on the entry tag.
- 6. Prizes will not be awarded to exhibits which are deemed unworthy.
- 7. When an exhibit is not labeled with correct name of variety or varieties, it is disqualified.

 - (c) Form. The shape and conformation of the apples in any plate of exhibit should be typical of the variety. All specimens should be uniform in shape. Because of the timing of the fair, immature fruit is allowed and color of such will be taken into consideration.



5-1: A DOZEN EGGS IN A NICE EGG TRAY THE EXHIBITOR DECIEDD TO DISPLAY IN. WITH A CARD ABOUT POULTRY INFORMAITON REQUESTED ATTATCHED TO EGG TRAY.

6-2A: EXHIBITOR DECIDED TO DO THEIR FREESTYLE WITH THEIR HONEYCOMB EXTRACTED FROM THEIR HIVE. THE COMB IS DISPLAYED WIHTIN A FRAME AS REQUESTED SO IT MAY BE VIEWED FROM BOTH SIDES.

EXHIBITOR THEN TOOK ALL 6 ITEMS AND CAREFULLY AND CREATIVLY DISPALYED THEM WITHIN A RUSTIC WAGON. PLACING ITEMS EXACTLY AS THEY WOULD WANT SOMEONE TO VIEW THEIR HOMESTEAD, BUT HAVING EACH ITEM EASILY ACCESSABLE TO JUDGES TO TEST AND REVIEW. EXHIBITOR WENT ABOVE AND BEYOND ADDING FABRICS AND FLORALS TO INCREASE THEIR CREATIVITY LEVEL. BUT ONLY HAD TAGS ON THE 6 ITEMS THE EXHIBITOR WISHED THEIR HOMESTEAD TO BE JUDGED ON.

Exhibit Rules and Regulations

In an effort to maintain professional gallery practices, Wayne County Fair implements the following rules and regulations for its juried exhibits.

We ask that Artists and Art makers read and adhere to the rules and regulations. The Wayne County Fair Domestics Department reserves the right to refuse submission to any Exhibit and will not accept artworks that do not comply with the stated rules and regulations.

Observing the following points ensures that your artwork will be exhibited in the best possible way.

We appreciate your support. ~ The Wayne County Fair Domestics Department 13

Originality and Prints

All entries must be original works and not previously shown in a Wayne County Fair Department.

Please be mindful of copyright infringements.

Copies and reproductions of original works of art, whether embellished or not, are not eligible for submission to exhibits. However, fine art prints such as photographs, lithographs, woodcuts, engravings, etchings, screen prints and digital works are acceptable as long as they are labeled as such and numbered as an edition.

Size

Maximum size for all artwork, is as follows:

Two- dimensional work, 2D, measurements are 48" in width and 48" in height. Three dimensional work, 3D, measurements are 36" in circumference width 60" in height.

Two Dimensional Art and Framing

All works on paper, including photographs, must be framed. Glass and Plexiglas must be clean inside and out, unscratched and intact.

Works on canvas must be framed or have gallery-wrapped, finished edges with no staples visible.

Frames must be in good condition, free of scratches and loose corners.

Mats must be clean and smoothly cut.

A hanging wire must be firmly attached to the back with screw-eyes or D-rings, and the wire not exceeding the top of the frame.

2-D pieces with saw tooth hangers will not be accepted. Dust covers or other backing material must be clean and intact.

Artwork must be completely dry at time of submission.

Three Dimensional Art

The Wayne County Fair is not accepting 3D art within Domestics Department Section 13 as of now. We are hoping to explore this option in the future. Please stay tuned.

Withdrawal

Work accepted for an exhibition may not be substituted, nor will any artwork be withdrawn during any exhibition, in any circumstance.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition

All Entries will be reviewed at the time of submission to ensure adherence to the artwork condition rules and regulations of the exhibit.

Inclusion / Exclusion in the exhibit is at the sole discretion of the Juror (not connected with The Wayne County Fair and is non-negotiable). The Superintendent of the WCF Domestics Department and Wayne County Fair reviews artwork for adherence to the Wayne County Fair rules and regulations only and reserves the right to refuse submission based on the terms stated within.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition (continued)

The number of pieces included in the exhibit will depend upon the space available and the size of the artworks selected. On average, this will be between 10 and 20 pieces.

The Wayne County Fair reserves the right to turn away any submissions that it deems inappropriate for our younger viewers or offensive in subject matter.

Works with overtly pornographic, discriminatory or violent messages may be barred from submission per the Wayne County Fair Domestics Superintendent and/or Board of Directors.

Statement of Responsibility

All entries are left at the owner's risk—The Wayne County Fair is not responsible for any loss or damage to submitted artwork by any means whatsoever.

The Wayne County Fair employees, staff, and volunteers will take all necessary precaution in handling artwork.

Awards

Three cash awards are given for each show: 1st Prize is \$100, 2nd Prize is \$75 and 3rd Prize is \$50.

Fees

All exhibitions require a non-refundable entry fee for each submission. \$10 per entry and artists may submit up to three images.

Sales

All artwork on exhibit must be For Sale.

All artwork sold in exhibitions at The Wayne County Fair are subject to a 30 % commission fee held by The Wayne County Fair. Artists receive 70% of the listed sales price of any artwork sold through exhibitions.

In order to receive payment for sold artwork, Artists must Submit Entry Forms and entry fee to the Wayne County Fair Secretary's office by August 2nd, 2025. The Artist will receive an Exhibitors number.

Payments for sold artwork are not processed until the exhibition has closed (6pm Sunday). Payments for artwork sold in any exhibition must be processed before 6 pm Sunday August 10th 2025 before the Secretary & Treasurers office is closed. This is also the time of Artwork Pickup.

The Superintendent of the WCF Domestics Department will notify Artists of the sale of art either by telephone or email.

Pick-Up of Artwork

Artwork must be picked up on Sunday August 10th between 6pm -8pm. There is a one week grace period for late pick-up, last chance for pick up for ONLY SECTION 13 is Sunday August 10th. Anyone who has not picked up their work after the specified pick-up day is subject to being assessed a storage fee.

Artwork that has not been picked up after 30 days of the exhibition closure, becomes the property of The Wayne County Fair.

Miscellaneous

The Wayne County Fair Domestics Superintendent must review and approve in advance, any unconventional methods of display or hanging presentation.

Once an accepted piece of artwork is installed in a show, no requests for moving any art pieces, or to change the location of any art pieces, will be considered or accepted.

Placement and position of art in any exhibit is up to the discretion of the Director and staff of The Wayne County Fair to place and to hang artwork. If there are requests and directions, in regard to any piece of art entered to an Exhibition, please supply and furnish those requests upon the art submission and delivery.



How the Mullet & Facial hair-dos will be Judged:



Size (20 Points)

The overall length, width, girth and density (fullness) of the hair. Beards are measured from the bottom of the lip to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched). Mullets are measured.

Mustaches must stop at the corner of the mouth. Mustaches growing below the corner of the mouth will be considered partial beard.

Quality (15 Points)

The graduation, taper, angle and thickness of individual hair follicles; the precise grooming (fly away hairs), sheen and symmetry of the hair style.

Style & Presentation (30 Points)

Does the facial hair fit the individual? Does the Mullet style fit the individual? Does it compliment the individuals overall style? These are considerations for the judges. How is the wearer of the facial hair's attitude, attention to the crowd, attire or overall look?

Dazzle (25 Points):

During the day of competition you may earn up to 25 more points through dazzle, how you portray yourself and hairstyle. Through Costume, and stage presence. The judges will be looking for individuals whose hairstyle reflects their hairs personality, individuals personality and costumes personality. Come dressed and ready to dazzle yourself across stage!

Audience Particiation (10 Points):

Strut your stuff, show your hairitude! Your 30 second stage walk can make or break you here! Hair flips and stare downs encouraged! Lets see what you got!

Each competitor has the opportunity to earn up to 100 Points total. The highest points will win in each category, and awards given to 1st - 4th place. Ties will be determined during the competition by stage presence and audience help!

Hair-do Definitions for Competitor Reference:





Mullet: is a hairstyle in which the hair is cut short at the front and sides, but left long at the back. Mullets are measured from the bottom of the ear lobe to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched).



Full Beard under 6'': Full beard as it grows and left natural, no longer than 6" (15 cm) below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better. The mustache may not be highlighted, and the beard may not be tucked under at the bottom. No styling aids allowed.

Full Beard Free Styled: Full beard as it grows and left natural, longer than 6" below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better.



Alaskan Whaler: Bushy hair grown along the jaw, chin and lower lip, and optionally on the cheeks. No hair grown on upper lip.

Common styles include: Alaskan Whaler (hair on cheeks) Amish (trimmed cheeks) Donegal (trimmed down to jawline)




Goatee : As it grows naturally, the more natural the better. Moustache not required. Goatee and Moustache can be accentuated but without styling aids. No curled Mustaches. There must be a clean shaven section at least 1.5" (4 cm, the width of a razor blade) between the onset of the head hair and the beard.



Chops/ Sideburns: (With a break Somewhere Beard) Must be a true side-burn, with no natural or shaven gap below the ear. Chin is shaven and hair is optional on the upper lip.

Common styles include: Classic Sideburns (trimmed short) Muttonchops (sideburns grown out at length) Friendly Muttonchops (sideburns grown at length, connected with a Moustache)






Partial Beard: A partial beard is any facial hair that is neither a full beard nor a mustache. Natural or shaven gaps define the different styles.

Natural partial beard: is any facial hair that is neither a full beard, nor only a Mustache, presented without the use of product. No styling aids permitted.



Common styles include: Natural Goatee (chin only) Van Dyke (connected mustache and chin beard) Triple Point/Musketeer (mustache with narrow, pointed chin beard)




Moustache: A Moustache is composed of facial hair above the upper lip. At International contests, it is agreed that Moustache hairs can start growing from up to a maximum of 5/8" (1.5 cm) beyond the end of the upper lip.



Moustache Natural: A natural Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, with no styling products permitted. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.



Moustache: Freestyle: A styled Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, styled with product. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.

Teams can pre-register all week in the Secretary's office, On Sunday, teams can register until 10 AM at the Main Office. Teams must show up to get their bed 1 hours prior to the race.

REGISTRATION FEE: FREE

Beds will be assigned based on first come first serve basis. The Wayne County Fair has 6 beds available to run for the race. If a team would like to provide their own bed they may, but the bed will go through an inspection prior to the race.

Competition Rules:

- 1. Any MINORS (under 18 years of age) must have the Waiver/Photo/Release Form signatures signed.
- 2. On the day of the event, your team/bed will be assigned a "lane space" on the track for judging. A Bed Monitor will be assigned to your team and will verify all the team documents BEFORE getting you registered in your race heat. It is recommended you are ready at 11:00 AM for Heat Registration, which your Bed Monitor will lead you through.
- 3. The person riding in the bed will be weighed to assure they weigh at least 75 pounds.
- 4. ALL members of the team MUST be with the bed for judging and team pictures.
- 5. All beds must be removed post-race and returned to the bed storage area. (Bed Monitors will give you that information during Heat Registration.) If you brought your own bed, you may leave it out for display in the Bed race Display area (The Bed monitor will also guide you to where that will be.) All beds must be removed from the fairgrounds by Sunday, August 10 at 6 pm.
- 6. All Participants must sign a waiver prior to participating in the competition.
- 7. Children under 12 years of age must have a parent sign the Waiver and be present during the competition.
- 8. Teams will be made up of 5 people. 4 runners, one on each corner of the bed. 1 Rider (See Rule 3) Ages 12 and up only (See Rule 7).
- 9. Team members cannot be switched out during competition. Team members may switch location on the bed, but may not swap out for a new member to race.
- 10. Determine which of four Divisions your team should compete in. (Adult teams may ultimately be combined into the Daily Runners division if necessary to ensure entertaining competition!)

Mutton Busters (ages 12 to 17) All riders must weigh at least 75 lbs. Every team member must be between 12 and 17 years old.

Bulldogging Doers (ages 18+) Rider and team members must be at least 18 years old, and rider must weigh at least 100 lbs.

Dally Runners (ages 31+) Rider and team members must be at least 31 years old, and rider must weigh at least 100 lbs.

Driving Daisies (runners ages 50+) Rider and team members must be 50+ and weigh a minimum of 100 lbs. Every team member must be 50+ years old..

- 11. Transform a bed into a racing vehicle to enter using Bed Construction Guidelines on Page 4. 149
- 12. Win an Award for Fastest Bed, Best Dressed Bed, and/or Crowd Favorite!
- 13. Beds may be unloaded at the Front Entrance of the Fair on W Jackson Street, if you are usung a Fair Bed you will inquire within the Secretarys office. You will need to arrive by 10:30 AM to pick up your bed.
- 14. Fair beds are for Pre-Registered Teams only.

BED CONSTRUCTION GUIDELINES:

- 1. Teams are responsible for the entry fee and all construction costs.
- 2. Beds must be at least 3 feet by 6 feet in area. For safety reasons, beds cannot be made from particle wood or particleboard.
- 3. Beds must have either a box spring OR a mattress and must lie flat in the bed frame. No air mattresses.
- 4. Push Bars (handles) are allowed but may not extend more than 16 inches from the bed frame. Handles must be designed for safety, with no sharp or jagged edges.
- Beds must have four wheels suitable for a clay/dirt track. You don't want to get bogged down!
 All four wheels must have contact with the ground at the finish line. All wheels must be load bearing but do not have to be the same size.
- 6. No bed may have motorized or mechanical means of motion. All means of motion shall be limited to race team members.
- 7. Steering mechanisms may be used.
- 8. The bed must be constructed in a fashion that all pushers are able to see the course from the front of the bed.

RACING INFO & GUIDELINES:

Team Rules:

- 1. Five (5) people per team. Substitutions are not allowed once the team checks in on Race Day. Teams can make a rider/runner switch before any heat if the rider meets age and weight requirements for that team category.
- 2. The rider must be riding on the bed for the entire heat.
- 3. Riders UNDER THE AGE OF 16 MUST wear a helmet or protective headgear. All team members must wear closed-toe shoes.
- 4. All four runners must be in contact with the bed when crossing the finish line to qualify.
- 5. No alcoholic beverages allowed during the race.
- 6. Failure to report for bed /heat registiration prior to race time will result in a disqualification.
- 7. Every team member MUST sign a waiver/photograph/release form.

RACE DAY INFORMATION

- The Race will be a straight run on W.Jackson Street, the street that the Main Entrance to the Wayne County Fair is on. The race will be approximately 100 yards in length. All races will be run in heats of two beds each. Heats and lanes will be chosen prior to race day registration. When the bed arrives, it will be assigned a specific staging location.
- ². Bed crews should deliver their beds to the fair grounds at the W.Jackson Street entrance on day of race. Make other plans with the Fair Secretary if you need to deliver it before hand. The delivery vehicle must drop off then can park in the fair grounds by going to the W. Foster St Gate.
- 3. The two-bed racing in the heat will line up at the Start Line.
- 4. Each Race Team will stay in their lane throughout the race. Should a team leave their assigned lane and interfere with another Team, the imposing Team will be disqualified, and the interfered Team will have the option of a restart.
- 5. Each Bed will receive a time for crossing the finish line. The fastest Teams from each category will receive a prize.
- 6. After the Bed Race, teams may either leave their beds set up at the Fair (until 6pm) or bring them home. Any beds left at the Fair must be picked up by 6pm Sunday afteroon.


