We support all laws pertaining to service animals, however if you have a service animal on the grounds during an event or the fair please inform us at the Main Office.

We thank you for your assistance with this request.

No "Pets" are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked. If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds.

These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal's protection as well as yours.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitor Rules

1. Articles not listed in this book will not be accepted for entry.
2. No premium will be paid upon any entry not made at the Secretary's Office.
3. All entries are entered and shown at the risk of the owner. The Union Agricultural Society at Palmyra will not be responsible in case of fire, theft, accidental or providential damage or destruction. Precautions will be taken, and experienced superintendents will be in charge of each show.
4. The Association reserves the right to substitute a judge at any time it deems necessary.
5. Livestock showing any signs of sickness or disease will be removed from the grounds at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
6. All entries are final. Payment of an entry fee signifies compliance with the rules set forth in this catalog.

NEW

7. **Any changes within ANY entries AFTER Saturday, August 8TH 2026 MUST** be brought to the attention of the Secretary **prior to Monday August 10th by NOON OR Thursday August 13th by 9AM (FOR DEPARTMENT 02-01- DAIRY CATTLE ONLY)**. This includes **changing of ANY entry even if it FALLS WITHIN THE SAME EXACT CLASS. EVEN MORE IMPORTANT IF IT IS A DIFFERENT CLASS.**
- 7A. In regard to rule 7. Transferring of entry fees from one entry to another or exchanging one entry for another due to a change in entry type/department/section/or class **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AFTER Monday August 10th by NOON.**
- 7B. ANY CHANGES IN ENTRIES AFTER THE DATES AND TIMES LISTED ABOVE WILL RESULT IN **A LATE ENTRY FEE AS WELL AS A "NEW ENTRY" ENTRY FEE.** AND MUST BE PAID TO THE SECRETARYS OFFICE **PROIOR TO JUDGING OF ENTRIES LISTED AS CHANGED OR NEW FROM EXHIBITOR.**
- 7C. **Entry Removal:** Removing an official entry after **Saturday, August 8TH** will result in the entry fee being donated to the Palmyra Agriculture Society A.K.A Wayne County Fair. **Entry Fees Are NO LONGER TRANSFERABLE OR REFUNDED AFTER SAID DATE LISTED.**
- 7D. Writing Checks: **There will be a Bounced Check Fee of \$25.00** Per Bounced Check plus the late Entry fee of that class and actual entry fee of that entry Item. For Any Bounced Checks that come through ANY of the Wayne County Fair Offices.

PLEASE NOTE

****The secretary is ALWAYS in Domestics from 8am- 5pm on Saturday, August 8TH****

8. The Wayne County Fair will not be responsible for special awards offered by anyone other than the Association.
9. No interference between exhibitor and judge will be allowed.
10. Except as noted in Department Rules, NO EXHIBIT, OPEN or 4-H Division, many be removed from the grounds **PRIOR to 6:00 PM, Sunday, August 9, 2026.(or Premium Monies Will Be FORFEITED).**
11. Good check, cash, or money order accepted in payment of entry fees.

REMINDER

12. **Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH WEST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.**

EXHIBITOR JUDGING SYSTEMS

FOR FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE RULES & REGULATIONS OF EXHIBITING, SEE THE OFFICIAL WCF EXHIBITOR RULES & REGULATIONS BOOK.

There are basically two systems of judging that are commonly used in fair judging, the American System and the Danish System. Check with the superintendent or agent in charge before you begin judging to clarify which system you will be using and how many placings you will be required to make.

AMERICAN STYLE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the American System of Judging, each exhibit is judged not only on its own merit, but in comparison to other exhibits using score cards prepared by the IAFE & State Division of Fairs and Expositions, and Fair Management. This system is used throughout all the divisions of the Fair, unless otherwise indicated, for awards and ribbons. Generally a “closed” judging system.

Departments that use this system:

Departments 5-8-9-10-12a&b-13

DANISH STYLE JUDGING SYSTEM

In this system all exhibitors receive a ribbon. All exhibits are grouped according to quality, and there may be multiple entries that get the same ranking and ribbon. Quality may vary from excellent to fair, and ribbon categories may be blue, red, white and/or yellow. In this system of judging, exhibits are not in competition with or compared to each other.

There is no formula to determine the number of ribbons to be given in the Danish System. Quality determines the ranking for blue, red, white and/or yellow ribbon. A blue ribbon is generally recognized and used for excellence. Red ribbons are given for an adequate exhibit that does not meet all the standards. White and/or yellow ribbons are given when the exhibit is below standard quality and improvement is definitely needed. Under the Danish system, participation ribbons are given to recognize the efforts of the exhibitor.

Departments that use this system:

4-H ONLY.

Honorable Mention Ribbons will be given at the discretion of the judges.

CONFERENCE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the Conference System of Judging, means that the entire group of exhibitors for a specific lot number meets with the judge, and the judge briefly discusses each exhibit with exhibitors. The judge will place each exhibit comparing it to the standard of perfection and the quality of the other exhibits according to the Danish system.

Departments that use this system:

4-H, Showmanship, some Open Livestock dpts.

FACE TO FACE JUDGING SYSTEM

In the Face to Face System of Judging, means that the exhibitor must be present at the time of judging and talk to the judge about his/her entry. This system is used for the Cloverbud and Exploring departments, and is designed to make the judging experience a positive learning experience for the young exhibitor.

Departments that use this system:

4-H, Showmanship, Open Livestock, Contests

Appearance

Condition of Work

Color Harmony

Plant Quality

Execution of the Work

Suitability of Materials

Flavor, Texture (Foods)

Accuracy of Design Reproduction

Types of Judging

There are two types of judging commonly used in county fairs and competitive events – open judging and closed judging.

Open judging is an open assessment by the judge before a group about the items in the exhibit. The exhibitors may be present. All exhibitors benefit from the discussion in open judging, although extra care must be taken so that the judge's comments do not embarrass exhibitors or cause unnecessarily hurt feelings.

Closed judging is done in a private area, where only the officials are allowed until the judging is completed. This is usually done when there are a large number of items in the exhibit, and/or when there is not enough room for spectators to listen to open judging. The judging is conducted prior to the opening of the event.

In some judging situations, score sheets are provided for judges to record comments for the exhibitor about the qualities desired and standards used for judging.

Remember, the most important thing is how YOU feel about your project and what you've learned. If you did your best, you can be proud of yourself and the experience you gained!

If you have a question about the judging of your department please ask your superintendent or the Fair secretary.

Animal Health Requirements For Admission to New York State and County Fairs

(Part 351 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Regulations)

NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets/Division of Animal Industry

The 2026 Animal Health Requirements for Admission to New York State and County Fairs, Part 351, or AI-202, now includes BOTH requirements for in-state and out-of-state animals. There will not be a separate document for interstate requirements. Where applicable, sections are clearly marked when requirements apply to in-state or out-of-state animals or both. This is the *only* document to print and refer to for 2026 fair regulations.

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- J. Commingling of Sheep and Cattle
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 - Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Llamas and Alpacas, Poultry, Deer/Elk, Miscellaneous Ruminants

A. General Prohibitions and Requirements

- No person shall bring or have present an animal on the fairgrounds for any reason (show, exhibit, raffle, demonstration, display) during a fair which is not qualified under NYS regulations.

- Any animal which is subject to inspection upon entry to the fairgrounds will be inspected without covering (wraps, coats, head gear, etc.).
- No person shall present an interstate or intrastate certificate of veterinary inspection that has been altered by anyone other than the issuing veterinarian.
- Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.
- Representatives of the Commissioner may deny admission to, or require removal from, the fair premises or require the segregation of any animal showing signs of, or exposed to, any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease.
- The fair board of directors has the authority to reject unworthy or unsightly exhibits for reasons other than infectious, contagious, or communicable disease (Part 350.10). The state veterinarian or animal health inspector will bring questionable exhibits to the attention of the fair board.
- All animals presented that originate from a location other than New York shall meet all New York State importation regulations in addition to the fair animal health requirements.

B. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- The CVI must be issued by a USDA Category 2 accredited veterinarian. Wet ink signatures for paper CVIs or e-signature for eCVIs are accepted.
- An e-CVI may be issued but a paper copy of the e-CVI is required for the animal check-in process so it can be physically initialed and dated by department staff.
- All animals must be officially identified. **All manmade and official ID must be recorded.**
- Only one species is allowed per CVI.

NEW YORK STATE-ORIGIN ANIMALS:

- ✓ A valid intrastate CVI (AI-61) is required for cattle, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, deer and miscellaneous ruminants.
- ✓ The CVI must be issued on or after May 1st of the current year.

OUT-OF-STATE ANIMALS:

- ✓ All animals entering New York State must satisfy both import requirements and fair requirements for that species and be accompanied by a valid interstate CVI.
- ✓ The interstate CVI is valid for 30 days from the date of CVI inspection. During the New York fair season (July 1 through Labor Day) valid CVIs can be used multiple times for entrance into a qualifying [NYS Agricultural Fair \(linked here\)](#)

(<https://www.nyfairs.org/>) The initial entrance into a ([qualifying NYS Agricultural Fair](#)) must be within 30 days of the date of CVI inspection. The name of the fair must be recorded on the CVI. For the CVI to be used for a later fair, it must be dated and initialed by a NYS Agriculture and Markets official noting the location of the initial, qualifying NYS Agricultural Fair. A change in health status or eligibility of an animal necessitates the generation of a new CVI.

- ✓ **New York does not participate in the New England Exhibition Show and Fair Circuit.**

C. Animal Identification

- All manmade and official ID must be recorded. Record full ID tag numbers.
- Do not record ID that is yet to be applied to / within an animal.
- Cattle: All cattle must be identified by an official USDA radio frequency identification (RFID) eartag, commonly referred to as an "840 RFID tag" or equivalent official RFID tag if the animal was tagged in another country.
- Sheep and Goats: All small ruminants must be identified by official scrapie identification.
- Swine: Swine must be identified by an official USDA approved ear tag. Radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tags, commonly referred to as "840 RFID tags," are strongly recommended.
- Equids: A complete written description is sufficient identification for horses entering New York accompanied by a CVI. The description must match the EIA test record. Horse sketches/photos and descriptions should reference color pattern, hair whorls, chestnuts, scars, and other markings as necessary to uniquely identify the horse. Names, tattoos and microchips, if any, are to be recorded. "Bay, no markings" is not an acceptable description for a CVI or EIA test record.
- Llamas and Alpacas: New world camelids must be identified by official ear tag or microchip.
- Miscellaneous Ruminants: They must be identified by unique ear tag or microchip (i.e.: aoudad, antelope, chamois)
- If you are exhibiting animals identified by microchip, a working reader must be supplied by the exhibitor. For questions on animal identification please contact your veterinarian or our office at 518-457-3502.

D. Rabies Vaccination

- Rabies vaccination is required for all species for which there is a USDA licensed vaccine available (cattle, horses, sheep, dog, cat, ferret) **and** that are *4 months of age or older* on the date of admission to the fair.
 - For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds.
- Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months. The exception is Imrab LA vaccine used in sheep which protects for 3 years after the second annual vaccination (consult your veterinarian).
- The rabies vaccination requirement must be met on the day of admission even if the animal was previously admitted to a fair when too young to vaccinate.
- Individual fairs can require animals for which there is no approved rabies vaccine to be vaccinated for rabies. The requirements outlined above would apply. The fair is responsible for notifying exhibitors.
- The [New York State Fair](#) requires rabies vaccination for all livestock species entering the grounds.

E. Acceptable Proof of Rabies Vaccination

- Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include a signed written statement from the veterinarian administering the vaccine to said described animal(s) or a valid certificate of veterinary inspection that has the vaccination listed and is signed by the Category 2 accredited veterinarian.
- **Acceptable proof of rabies vaccination must include the name of the product used, the date of administration, and the duration of immunity if longer than one year (applies to sheep only).**
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is included on a paper EIA test record, the test record must be signed certifying the vaccination in addition to the required signature for the EIA test record.
- If the statement of rabies vaccination is electronically entered into an eEIA test record, only one electronic signature is required.
- Rabies titers are not acceptable proof of rabies protection and cannot be used to meet entry requirements.
- **A veterinary clinic invoice is not sufficient proof of rabies vaccination.**
- Acceptable proof of vaccination for dogs is a valid rabies vaccination certificate or a copy of the dog license that contains the rabies vaccination information.

F. BVD-PI Testing

- All cattle, llamas, and alpacas exhibited at NY county fairs, or the [New York State Fair](#) must be negative to an approved test appropriate to detect **Bovine Viral Diarrhea persistent infection (BVD-PI)**. Official ID must be in the animal prior to sampling. The testing veterinarian is responsible to make sure the proper test is conducted. This is a once in a lifetime test that must be reported on the required certificate of veterinary inspection. The issuing veterinarian is responsible for verifying the validity of the test, existing official identification of the animal, and recording the test date on the CVI. If a previous test or official identification is not verifiable, the test must be repeated.

G. Cleaning and Disinfection

- All buildings on the fairgrounds housing animals must be cleaned and disinfected prior to the opening of the fair and between groups of animals when housing is rotated (Section 50.2 of Agriculture and Market regulations).

H. Animal Deaths

- Occasionally animal deaths occur at a fair. If a death occurs, it must be reported to the state veterinarian in charge as soon as possible for review. The animal must be promptly removed from the public exhibit area to a secure location and held for the veterinarian prior to disposal.

I. Calving, Kidding, and Lambing

- Any cattle, goats, or sheep that calve, kid, or lamb while at a county fair or the State Fair will be **ordered removed from the fairgrounds** along with their offspring, unless the animals are part of a birthing demonstration.

J. Commingling of Sheep and Cattle

- Due to the potential spread of malignant catarrhal fever from sheep to cattle, it is strongly recommended that cattle be kept separate from sheep.

K. Commingling of Swine and Poultry

- Due to the potential spread of influenza virus, it is recommended that swine and poultry be housed in separate locations.

L. Isolation upon Returning Home

- The owner or custodian shall keep show animals biologically separate from the herd or flock for a period of at least two weeks after returning to the premises of origin. If any illness is noted in the exhibition animals, the owner should contact their veterinarian immediately.

M. Individual Species Requirements

- Beginning in 2026, each species has its own entry requirements listed based on if animals originated from within New York or from out of state.

HORSES

NEW YORK STATE-ORIGIN HORSES:

1. No CVI required.
2. Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test is required for all horses 6 months of age or older. The horse must be accompanied by a valid negative EIA test record, signed by a USDA Category 2 accredited veterinarian. For most rabies vaccines, the earliest age allowable for primary vaccination is 3 months (12 weeks). Animals that

- are vaccinated prior to 84 days of age will need to be re-vaccinated according to label before entering the fairgrounds. Vaccine must have been administered within the past 12 months.  - a. Negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition.
 - b. Poultry qualified by 90-day test must be identified by an official leg band.

-OR-

- a. Proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock.
- b. Proof of NPIP status must be in the form of an NPIP certificate or purchase receipt containing NPIP certification information. If you utilize a receipt, it must be dated within 1 year of the date of admission to the fair.

OUT-OF-STATE POULTRY:

All animals entering New York State must satisfy both import requirements and fair health requirements for that species. Poultry, including waterfowl, must meet one of the movement documentation and testing protocols described below. Pigeons and doves require documentation only.

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 days prior to entry
 - a. Including identification by an official leg band
 - b. Pullorum-typhoid negative test within 90 days of entry
 - c. Negative Avian influenza test on flock in which 30 birds were tested for avian influenza within 10 days prior to entry. If there are less than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds.

-OR-

2. USDA NPIP Form 9-3
 - a. Poultry originates from an NPIP US Pullorum-Typhoid clean Flock
 - b. Negative Avian influenza test on flock in which 30 birds were tested for avian influenza within 10 days prior to entry. If there are less than 30 birds in the flock, test all birds.

-OR-

3. USDA NPIP Form 9-3
 - a. Poultry originates from NPIP US Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock
 - b. Poultry originates from NPIP US H5H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock

BARN RULES for 2026

In order to maintain safety to all fair attendees, the Wayne County Fair Board of Directors has established the following Barn Rules.

1. Overnights in the Barn: -Absolutely No one under the age of 18 is allowed to stay/be in the barns without a Chaperone after 10 PM.
-ONLY exhibitors are allowed to stay/be in the barns overnight.
-Youth should be in the barns at the time listed in rule 2.
-This policy will be strictly enforced.
2. Barns will close at 10 PM and lights will be turned off at 11 PM.
3. **NO ALCOHOL IS PERMITTED IN THE BARN AT ANY TIME!!!**
4. **Cigarette smoking, cigar smoking and pipe smoking are prohibited at all times. This includes electronic smoking devices.**
5. Manure is to be placed in or on the side of the dumpster where signs are placed. **NO MANURE AND NO MILK is to be put in Garbage Totes.** The disposal of milk should be done down the drains of the wash rack and washed down with water.
6. Do not move garbage totes from where they are placed. If one is filled, notify a superintendent.
7. The barn aisle and wash rack areas are to be kept free of grooming tools, equipment, hair and manure. Hoses should be coiled after use. PLEASE clean up after your animal. Keep outside of the barn clean and free of hay, straw, and manure.
8. For public safety, please use nearest exit for moving animals in and out of the barn.
9. Grooming Chutes must be stored outside and are only allowed inside the barn on show days. The chutes MUST not block the aisles.
10. Keep aisles clean – Keep aisles free from garbage, straw and manure so spectators are able to walk freely through the barns. The aisles also serve as a fire lane and need to be kept open at **ALL** times for this reason.
11. Keep doorways open and free from tack, supplies, chairs, beds, etc. It is important to keep all fire lanes open in case of an emergency.
12. Wash Racks – Please keep the wash racks clean. Manure, grain and water needs to freely flow down the drain. If there is an issue, please make the Livestock Superintendents aware of the situation. **DO NOT continue to fill the rack and have it over flow. DO NOT REMOVE SCREWS AND OPEN DRAINS!!**
13. Absolutely no running, shouting, cursing, ball playing or activity that could interfere with public safety is allowed.
14. **Any trailer staying overnight will be parked on the SOUTH WEST CORNER of the fairgrounds in the trailer parking area. Any trailer left over night North of the horse show ring will be moved by fair personal.**
15. **ALL OPEN SHOWS ARE TO BE EXECUTED AND SHOWN WITHIN THE PROVIDED SHOW RING AREAS. EXHIBITORS ARE SUBJECT TO FOREFITTING PREMIUMS IF SHOWS ARE NOT COMPLETED DURING DESIGNATED SHOW TIME AS WELL AS IN A PROPER SHOW RING. UNLESS OTHERWISE DISCUSSED AND APPROVED BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS.**

REMINDER

We support all laws pertaining to service animals, however if you have a service animal on the grounds during an event or the fair please inform us at the Main Office. We thank you for your assistance with this request. No “Pets” are allowed on the fairgrounds during ANY Event, as they are Not Fair Vet Checked.

If an event has a class or demonstration containing dogs those animals need to follow the NYS Animal Health Requirements, once the event is completed they are required to leave the fairgrounds. These rules will be strictly adhered to for the animal’s protection as well as yours.

NO DOGS ON THE FAIR GROUNDS DURING ANY EVENT!!

Your cooperation in recognizing the importance of these rules, as well as adhering to them, is greatly appreciated. Any offense in breaking these rules could result in the removal of you and your animal(s) from the property and any premium money will be forfeited. 3. No animal shall be entered in more than one (1) class, except that animals shown single will be eligible for entry in the group classes and the best udder class. All animals shown in groups must be shown in appropriate age classes.
4. Registration and health papers are to be presented to the superintendent for inspection before unloading at the fairgrounds.
5. Junior Get of Sire shall consist of three (3) animals, under 2 years of age from the same sire.
6. Produce of Dam shall consist of two (2) animals from the same mother.
7. Dairy herd shall consist of three (3) females, of any age, that have calved at least once.
8. Every exhibitor must file with the superintendent the Health Report and Registry Papers of all animals exhibited, before animals are unloaded. These will be returned by the superintendent at the close of the fair.
9. All hay, straw and grain must be furnished by the exhibitor.

A dry cow is any cow which is now dry and has completed at least one lactation. A dry cow can show in either the dry cow class or the appropriate age group. A milking cow can not be shown in the dry cow class.

11. Judging procedure will follow in numerical sequence in each respective breed.
12. Judging of classes will be alternated between breeds.
13. The Wayne County Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss, damage or accident to livestock, person or property from any cause while at the fairgrounds. Entries are received upon this condition only.

The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics
(Adopted by PDCA in March 1970; Revised March 1971, February 1977, February 1982,
February 1986, February 1988, and February 1989)

The showing of registered dairy cattle is an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the various dairy breed associations to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding registered dairy cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors. In this connection, The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association believes that it is in the best interest of the breeders of registered dairy cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring. It recognizes that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle which are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the cataloging, handling, and presentation of cattle in the show ring which are unacceptable.

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the showing of registered dairy cattle:

1. Misrepresenting the age and/or milking status of the animal for the class for which it is shown.
2. Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally, with an irritant or counter-irritant, or other substance to artificially improve the conformation.
3. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
4. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.
5. Setting Teats.

The following practices and procedures are considered to detract from the image of the show ring when carried to excess and will be given slight to serious discrimination in placing animals within class.

1. Excessive manipulation of the hair.
2. Use of artificial hair except for false switches.
3. Unsportsmanlike conduct on part of showmen.
4. Improper fitting practices such as over filling and over bagging.

Practices which should be encouraged to enhance the image of the show:

1. Establish uniform dress code for exhibitors in the show ring.
2. Recognize good herdsmanship and exhibits in the barn.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are an individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. Violations of these policies are subject to disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and/or show management.

Holstein Show Ring Policy

The showing of Registered Holstein cattle is an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the Holstein Association of America to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding Registered Holstein cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors. In this connection, the Board of Directors of the Holstein Association of America believes that it is in the best interest of the breeders of Registered Holstein cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring. It recognizes that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle which are necessary in the course of moving dairy cattle to and between shows that are advisable to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the cataloging, handling, and presentation of cattle in the show ring which are unacceptable.

The following practices are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the showing of Registered Holstein cattle:

4. Surgery or insertion of foreign material under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
5. Critizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show.

The following practices and procedures are considered to detract from the image of the show ring when carried to excess and will be given slight to serious discrimination in placing animals within class.

1. Excessive manipulation of the hair.

Five (5) apples, pears, peaches; **Twelve (12)** plums, crabapples; and **Three (3)** clusters of grapes.
4. A Diamond shall consist of **Sixteen (16) specimens.**
5. All exhibits entered in this department shall become the property of the Palmyra Union Agricultural Society unless prior arrangements are made with the department superintendent. If so, “Hold” must be written on the entry tag.
6. Prizes will not be awarded to exhibits which are deemed unworthy.
7. When an exhibit is not labeled with correct name of variety or varieties, it is disqualified.
8. In placing awards, the judge will be guided by the following; and exhibitors would do well to select their fruit on the same basis.
 - (a) Freedom from blemish. Show fruit should be absolutely free from marks of fungus or physiological trouble including water core, insect injuries of any kind, and mechanical injuries such as loss of stem, burn, russet or limb rub.
 - (b) Color. All specimens in any entry should be of uniform color. With red apples, the more color the better, if typical of the variety. In yellow or green apples, the color should be even all over. The presence or absence of blush will not count in uniformity of color.
 - (c) Form. The shape and conformation of the apples in any plate of exhibit should be typical of the variety. All specimens should be uniform in shape. Because of the timing of the fair, immature fruit is allowed and color of such will be taken into consideration.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All entries must be grown by exhibitor.
2. 1 exhibit per class per exhibitor.
3. Exhibits will be judged on uniformity, freedom from blemishes, and overall quality. Prizes will not be awarded to exhibits which are unworthy.
4. All exhibits entered in this department shall become the property of the Palmyra Union Agricultural Society unless prior arrangements are made with the department superintendent. **“HOLD”** shall be written on all entry tags where the exhibitor wishes to reclaim exhibit after the fair is completed.
5. All items may be made from cow, sheep, or goat. Alternate milk styles also accepted (almond, hemp, etc.) Items must be labeled with date of process, origin (Jersey cow, almond), and ingredients - **MUST BE WRITTEN ON A 3X5 INDEX CARD.**
6. Eggs must include label with breed of hens and dates of laying. All items will be judged based on quality and uniformity, shape, etc.
7. Processed items do NOT have to come from your own milking stock (you can purchase milk elsewhere and process it to cheese, yogurt, etc.) Items will be displayed in cooler.
8. Processed items **MUST** include a 3 x 5 index card with recipe and/or process.

4. All exhibits must be done by members of that Grange.
5. NO members associated with the booths in any way, may be in the area when the booths are being judged.
Judging will take place on Monday, August 10th, at 10:00 a.m.
6. Scoring rules: The following scoring value will be used by the judges to evaluate each exhibit. The judges will be instructed to use these values and the decision of the judges will be final.

Exhibit Rules and Regulations

In an effort to maintain professional gallery practices, Wayne County Fair implements the following rules and regulations for its juried exhibits.

We ask that Artists and Art makers read and adhere to the rules and regulations. The Wayne County Fair Domestic Department reserves the right to refuse submission to any Exhibit and will not accept artworks that do not comply with the stated rules and regulations.

Observing the following points ensures that your artwork will be exhibited in the best possible way.

Originality and Prints

All entries must be original works and not previously shown in a Wayne County Fair Department.

Please be mindful of copyright infringements.

Copies and reproductions of original works of art, whether embellished or not, are not eligible for submission to exhibits. However, fine art prints such as photographs, lithographs, woodcuts, engravings, etchings, screen prints and digital works are acceptable as long as they are labeled as such and numbered as an edition.

Size

Maximum size for all artwork, is as follows:

Two-dimensional work, 2D, measurements are 48" in width and 48" in height .

Three dimensional work, 3D, measurements are 36" in circumference width 60" in height.

Two Dimensional Art and Framing

All works on paper, including photographs, must be framed. Glass and Plexiglas must be clean inside and out, unscratched and intact.

Works on canvas must be framed or have gallery-wrapped, finished edges with no staples visible.

Frames must be in good condition, free of scratches and loose corners.

Mats must be clean and smoothly cut.

A hanging wire must be firmly attached to the back with screw-eyes or D-rings, and the wire not exceeding the top of the frame.

2-D pieces with saw tooth hangers will not be accepted.

Dust covers or other backing material must be clean and intact.

Artwork must be completely dry at time of submission.

Three Dimensional Art

The Wayne County Fair is not accepting 3D art within Domestic Department Section 13 as of now. We are hoping to explore this option in the future. Please stay tuned.

Withdrawal

Work accepted for an exhibition may not be substituted, nor will any artwork be withdrawn during any exhibition, in any circumstance.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition

All Entries will be reviewed at the time of submission to ensure adherence to the artwork condition rules and regulations of the exhibit.

Inclusion / Exclusion in the exhibit is at the sole discretion of the Juror (not connected with The Wayne County Fair and is non-negotiable). The Superintendent of the WCF Domestic Department and Wayne County Fair reviews artwork for adherence to the Wayne County Fair rules and regulations only and reserves the right to refuse submission based on the terms stated within.

Review and Inclusion in Exhibition (continued)

The number of pieces included in the exhibit will depend upon the space available and the size of the artworks selected. On average, this will be between 10 and 20 pieces.

The Wayne County Fair reserves the right to turn away any submissions that it deems inappropriate for our younger viewers or offensive in subject matter.

Works with overtly pornographic, discriminatory or violent messages may be barred from submission per the Wayne County Fair Domestic Superintendent and/or Board of Directors.

Statement of Responsibility

All entries are left at the owner's risk—The Wayne County Fair is not responsible for any loss or damage to submitted artwork by any means whatsoever.

The Wayne County Fair employees, staff, and volunteers will take all necessary precaution in handling artwork.

Awards

Three cash awards are given for each show: 1st Prize is \$100, 2nd Prize is \$75 and 3rd Prize is \$50.

Fees

All exhibitions require a non-refundable entry fee for each submission. \$10 per entry and artists may submit up to three images.

Sales

All artwork on exhibit must be For Sale.

All artwork sold in exhibitions at The Wayne County Fair are subject to a 30 % commission fee held by The Wayne County Fair. Artists receive 70% of the listed sales price of any artwork sold through exhibitions.

In order to receive payment for sold artwork, Artists must Submit Entry Forms and entry fee to the Wayne County Fair Secretary's office by August 8th, 2026. The Artist will receive an Exhibitors number.

Payments for sold artwork are not processed until the exhibition has closed (6pm Sunday). Payments for artwork sold in any exhibition must be processed before 6 pm Sunday August 16th 2026 before the Secretary & Treasurers office is closed. This is also the time of Artwork Pickup.

The Superintendent of the WCF Domestic Department will notify Artists of the sale of art either by telephone or email.

Pick-Up of Artwork

Artwork must be picked up on Sunday August 10th between 6pm -8pm. There is a one week grace period for late pick-up, last chance for pick up for ONLY SECTION 13 is Sunday August 10th. Anyone who has not picked up their work after the specified pick-up day is subject to being assessed a storage fee.

Artwork that has not been picked up after 30 days of the exhibition closure, becomes the property of The Wayne County Fair.

Miscellaneous

The Wayne County Fair Domestic Superintendent must review and approve in advance, any unconventional methods of display or hanging presentation.

Once an accepted piece of artwork is installed in a show, no requests for moving any art pieces, or to change the location of any art pieces, will be considered or accepted.

Placement and position of art in any exhibit is up to the discretion of the Director and staff of The Wayne County Fair to place and to hang artwork. If there are requests and directions, in regard to any piece of art entered to an Exhibition, please supply and furnish those requests upon the art submission and delivery.

Rules of Participation:

1. Contestants must be 12 years old or younger.
* Unfortunately, children who exceed the weight limit will not be allowed to participate regardless of age .
2. There will be 4 classes of contestants.
Class 1- under 42 lbs.
Class 2- 42-59 lbs.
Class 3- 60-75 lbs.
Class 4- 76-95 lbs.
3. All contestants must wear shoes. No bare feet or flip flops are allowed.
4. Contestants may be given an additional attempt to get the sled moving from starting if first attempt is unsuccessful.
5. Both hands must be on the steering wheel and both feet must be on the pedals.
Standing is not allowed.
6. The pulling tractor must stay between the lines of the pulling lane at all times.
7. The contestant must remain seated at all times.
8. There will be no jerking at any time on the chain of the sled.
9. Within the first three feet of track, if the child's foot comes off the pedal, the pull will be started over.
10. After three feet, when the child's foot comes off the pedal, that pull is considered done.
11. Forward motion is considered stopped when the sled pull chain becomes loose or the child cannot pull anymore, at the track officials' discretion.
12. The pull begins when the official shouts "go".
13. The pull ends when the tractor has crossed the finish line or the tractor stops moving, whichever occurs first.
14. All pulls will be measured from the starting line to the front of the trailer.
15. When any part of the tractor or sled touches the white boundary line, the pull is done.
16. If the equipment should malfunction, the child will be allowed to re-pull.

All track officials decisions will be final.

We reserve the right to stop an individual pull at our discretion if the possibility of injury is present.

We reserve the right to change the rules at any time.

How the Mullet & Facial hair-dos will be Judged:



Size (20 Points)

The overall length, width, girth and density (fullness) of the hair. Beards are measured from the bottom of the lip to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched). Mullets are measured.

Mustaches must stop at the corner of the mouth. Mustaches growing below the corner of the mouth will be considered partial beard.

Quality (15 Points)

The graduation, taper, angle and thickness of individual hair follicles; the precise grooming (fly away hairs), sheen and symmetry of the hair style.

Style & Presentation (30 Points)

Does the facial hair fit the individual? Does the Mullet style fit the individual? Does it compliment the individuals overall style? These are considerations for the judges. How is the wearer of the facial hair's attitude, attention to the crowd, attire or overall look?

Dazzle (25 Points):

During the day of competition you may earn up to 25 more points through dazzle, how you portray yourself and hairstyle. Through Costume, and stage presence. The judges will be looking for individuals whose hairstyle reflects their hairs personality, individuals personality and costumes personality. Come dressed and ready to dazzle yourself across stage!

Audience Particiation (10 Points):

Strut your stuff, show your hairitude! Your 30 second stage walk can make or break you here! Hair flips and stare downs encouraged! Lets see what you got!

Each competitor has the opportunity to earn up to 100 Points total. The highest points will win in each category, and awards given to 1st - 4th place. Ties will be determined during the competition by stage presence and audience help!

Hair-do Definitions for Competitor Reference:

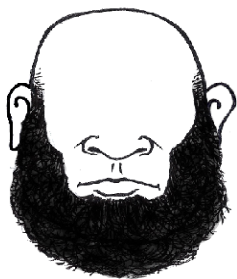


Mullet: is a hairstyle in which the hair is cut short at the front and sides, but left long at the back. Mullets are measured from the bottom of the ear lobe to the end of the longest follicle that hangs naturally (meaning not stretched).



Full Beard under 6”: Full beard as it grows and left natural, no longer than 6” (15 cm) below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better. The mustache may not be highlighted, and the beard may not be tucked under at the bottom. No styling aids allowed.

Full Beard Free Styled: Full beard as it grows and left natural, longer than 6” below the bottom of the lower lip, the more natural the better.



Alaskan Whaler: Bushy hair grown along the jaw, chin and lower lip, and optionally on the cheeks. No hair grown on upper lip.

Common styles include:

Alaskan Whaler (hair on cheeks)

Amish (trimmed cheeks)

Donegal (trimmed down to jawline)



Goatee : As it grows naturally, the more natural the better. Moustache not required. Goatee and Moustache can be accentuated but without styling aids. No curled Mustaches. There must be a clean shaven section at least 1.5” (4 cm, the width of a razor blade) between the onset of the head hair and the beard.



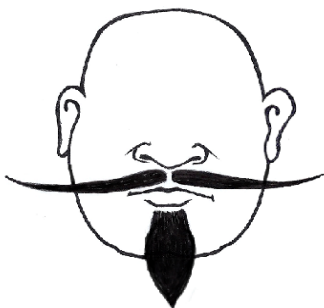
Chops/ Sideburns: (With a break Somewhere Beard) Must be a true side-burn, with no natural or shaven gap below the ear. Chin is shaven and hair is optional on the upper lip.

Common styles include:

Classic Sideburns (trimmed short)

Muttonchops (sideburns grown out at length)

Friendly Muttonchops (sideburns grown at length, connected with a Moustache)



Partial Beard: A partial beard is any facial hair that is neither a full beard nor a mustache. Natural or shaven gaps define the different styles.

Natural partial beard: is any facial hair that is neither a full beard, nor only a Mustache, presented without the use of product. No styling aids permitted.



Common styles include:

Natural Goatee (chin only)

Van Dyke (connected mustache and chin beard)

Triple Point/Musketeer (mustache with narrow, pointed chin beard)

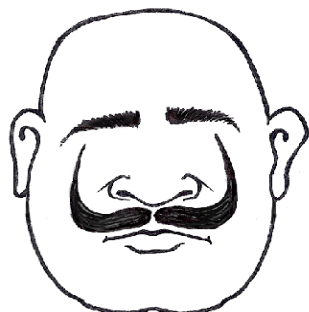


Moustache: A Moustache is composed of facial hair above the upper lip. At International contests, it is agreed that Moustache hairs can start growing from up to a maximum of 5/8" (1.5 cm) beyond the end of the upper lip.



Moustache Natural: A natural Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, with no styling products permitted. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.



Moustache: Freestyle: A styled Moustache is any length of hair grown from above the upper lip and beneath the nose, styled with product. The Moustache hairs should be connected up to a maximum of 0.6 inch (1.5 cm) beyond the edge of the upper lip.

Chin hair is not permitted in this class: no "goatees"/van dykes, musketeers, etc. Sideburns unconnected to the Moustache are permitted. They cannot be overstated, and will not be considered during judging.

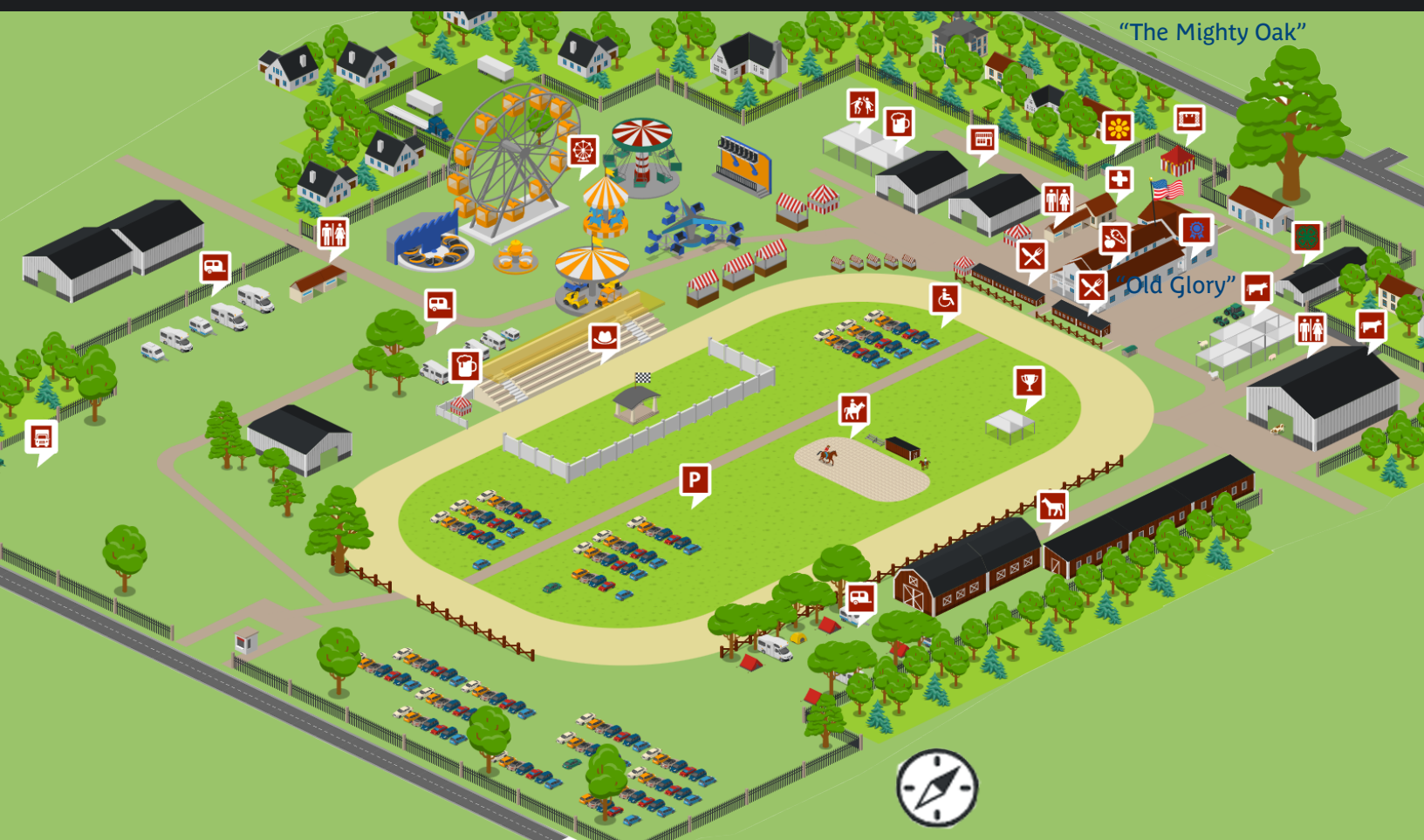
